
The Clark County Treasurer's Office is an independent financial arm of county government. It is my honor to share a few highlights from Q3 2021.

Joint Lobby Reopening

The Clark County Public Service Center second floor Joint Lobby has re-opened to customer appointments on Tuesdays and Thursdays. In July, we opened our doors to in-person services on Mondays and Wednesdays and added appointments on Fridays. The graph illustrates lobby traffic statistics since reopening our inperson services. The partner offices of the Assessor, Auditor, and Treasurer are happy to be able to provide safe inperson services after a year and a half of closure.

Second Half Property Tax Statements

November 1 will conclude our first tax season with offices open for walk-in and appointment services since we closed to the public in April 2020 due to COVID-19. Collection rates hit 55% in Q3 and we expect to have a strong property tax collection in the second half. Statements were mailed on September 15 and because October 31 falls on a Sunday, taxpayers will be able to remit their payments by November 1 to have their payment considered timely.

Banking Transition Update

All accounts transitioning to J.P. Morgan are now open and operational. We went live with deposits on September 1 and live with payments on October 1. The transition is slated to be fully complete by Jan. 1, 2022.
