1:40 – 1:55 p.m.	Presentation outlining proposal for the Environmental Health Assessment • Packets including itemized checklist, sample report, and proposed certificate of completion.	Presenters: Christine Harper and Sara Schroeder (CCPH) Key messaging: • 2020 is a volunteer year • Fee will be hourly • First three-year cycle for assessments runs 2021 – 2024 • Scheduling is up to the districts to coordinate with CCPH • CCPH can conduct ~50 assessments per year Preparing for assessments: • Schools will be in contact with a CCPH representative. • Focus will be informed by district and specific school's needs. Performing the assessment: • Coordinate with CCPH on best day/time. • WAC requirements will be primary focus. • Secondary focus will be on recommendations from K12 guided by specific school needs.

		Reporting:
		Reports will draw distinctions between WAC requirements and recommendations.
		 Draft report will be sent to district representative for review and comment.
		After review and comment, the final report will be provided with a Certification of Completion
1:55– 2:20 p.m.	Discussion	Questions/Suggestions asked after presentation:
		What will be the process after a report is issued?
		 CCPH will help the schools prioritize items to be addressed. CCPH will be available as a resource and provide updated information on topics related to School Environmental Health.
		Where are the reports published to?
		• They are internal; however they will be public record. Reports can go to whomever the district likes.
		What areas of the schools will be assessed?
		• Student occupied locations will be the focus of the Environmental Health Assessment, such as but not limited to classrooms, common areas, playgrounds and cafeterias.
		Does someone need to walk with the Environmental Health Specialist during assessment?
		• Each location can decide if they want someone walking with the Environmental Health Specialist. At the end of the assessment there would be a meeting to discuss findings before the draft report is sent.
		What about work practices?
		• Things like eye protections, hair restraint, safe zones for the students will be observed. Staff safety and ergonomics will not.
		When will 2021 fees be known?

		 Council approves PH fees in late November, early December. PH will share anticipated fees with districts as early as possible ~mid July.
		What if the cost of recommended changes is financially restrictive?
		 Recommendations are just that, recommendations. Findings that are supported by WAC will be listed with flexibility in the timeframe they're required to be addressed such as "at the next remodel."
		Are grants available to help supplement this work?
		 Possibly. CCPH is actively looking for grant opportunities to help support this work.
2:20 – 2:30	What to do when things don't go as expected (power outage, water shutoff, heat/boiler issues, etc.)	Brian Schlottmann (CCPH) outlined some examples of past experiences when schools have notified PH of facility issues.
		Question posed to the group; how can PH support schools during these events?
		 A decision wasn't made but the idea of a resource guide that outlines major topics and including when PH should be notified. The conversation will continue as PH works on this guide and asks for support in creating a resource that schools and districts can use.
