

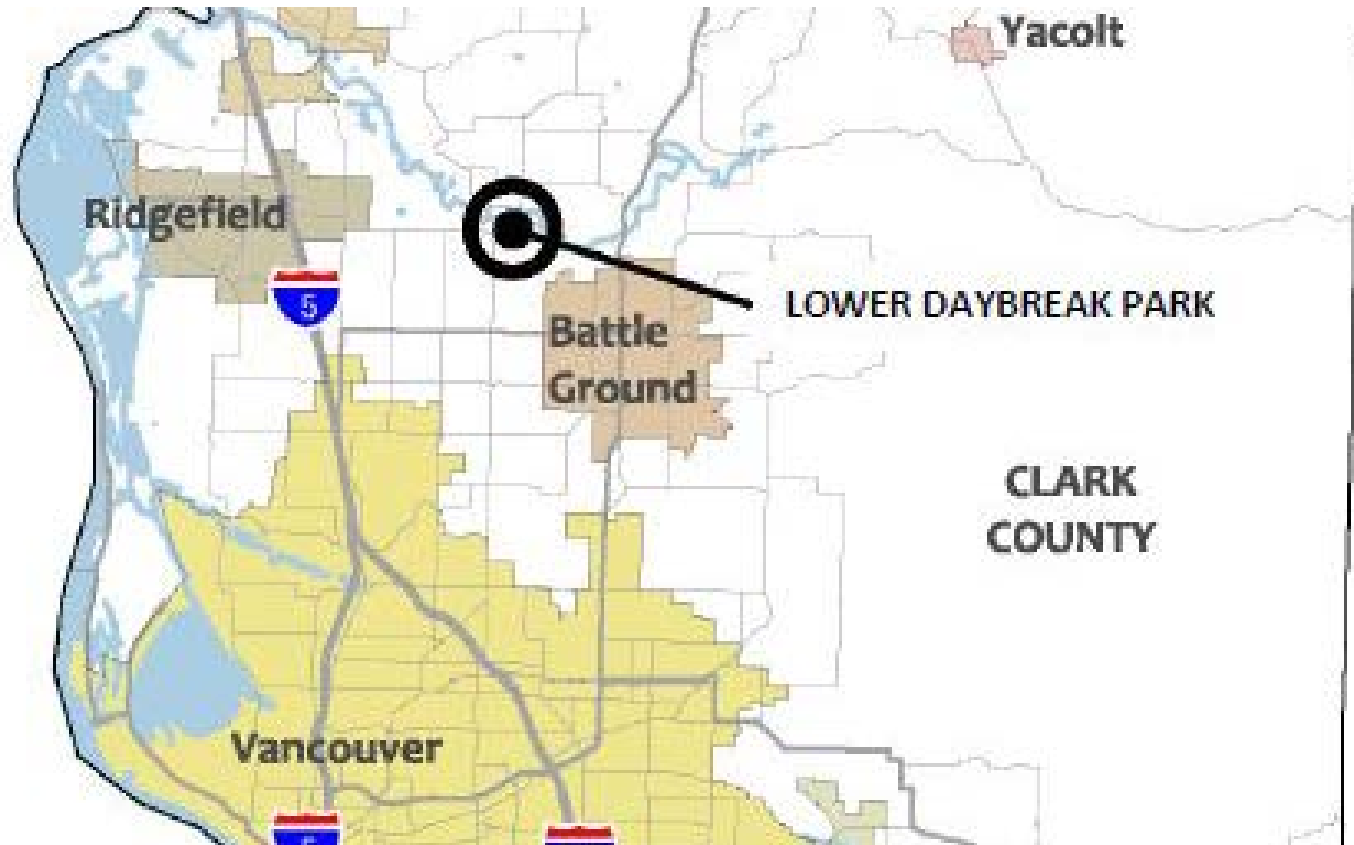

Project Information

- Description
 - Install over $\frac{3}{4}$ miles of multiuse paved and gravel trails with designated areas for views of the East Fork Lewis River
 - Install amenities such as benches and picnic tables.
 - Install access path to the East Fork Lewis River
 - Install accessible trailhead that connects to existing Daybreak Boat Launch Parking Lot
- Funding
 - \$500K grant from Washington State Recreation and Conservation Office
- Outreach
 - Extensive Master Plan Outreach
 - PAB Meeting – July 2019
 - Clark County Fair – August 2019
 - Open House – August 2019
 - Social Media Outreach
 - PAB Meeting – November 2019
 - Public Hearing – May 2020
 - PAB Meeting – September 2020



Current Project Status – 99% Design

- Currently in final engineering review process with Community Development
- Next step final PS&E
- Bid planned for November 2020
- RCO approved bid additives
- Construction planned for January - June 2021
- Mitigation planting planned for Fall 2021 or 2022
