- I. ROLL CALL, APPROVAL OF MINUTES February 6th, 2020 (*00:09:50)

 - WSU Business Degree in Operations Management
 - Currently Farm Manager at Clark County Heritage Farm
 - Active in Farm Bureau
- **III. UPDATES** (*00:13:57)
 - Clark County Public Health Solid Waste Program
 - SWEO Green Team updates provided ahead of time. Highlights include:
 - Both MCR and Green Business have shifted to an online presence
 - □ Trying to promote through social media
 - RAF cancelled this year
 - ☐ Might do something in the winter season
 - SWEO team is currently working from home due to COVID-19
 - Clark County Public Health Solid Waste Enforcement
 - 2020 Quarter 1 has come out
 - 9 inspections
 - Since April, there have been no inspections
 - □ Inspections will start again next week
 - o Kyle asks if any headway has been made with CC Public Works, on Watley Pit
 - PW is working with Dept. of Ecology on their Contaminated Sites program
 - SWE is receiving updates from PW as they come in
 - PW is asking for a more thorough evaluation of the site
 - Brian will send an email update when more information is known
 - Code update has been pushed out a bit due to COVID-19

Requirement

- Had RFQ out to hire a consultant for public outreach at ~\$50,000
 - □ Decided not to hire consultant during COVID outbreak

! Action

- □ Continuing with in-house revisions Would like to get a copy of the update to SWAC by June, for review, but may be delayed The schedule for approval is still about a year and a half out ☐ Hoping to get copy to SWAC by July Public outreach plans included in person outreach events at three points in the county □ Now starting to look into an online public outreach session No current timeline estimated City of Vancouver Yard Debris contract updates have been delayed Scheduled date with council has been bumped to later in May New "piggy-back" provision in the contracts may benefit other cities and the county CoV Spring yard debris coupon program has been extended an extra month Outreach becoming an online format, including classroom presentations and trainings o COVID-19 has impacted neighborhood clean-up events Typically 50 a year, with Waste Connections □ 2 per weekend, from March to November Had to cancel or postpone all of March, April, and May, affecting 21 neighborhoods Working with CDC, State and Public Health on safety guidance for this service ☐ Hoping to deliver this service at a later time Monitoring illegal dumping Concerns over residents delaying trips to the transfer stations, or financial hardships, leading to illegal dumping **Waste Connections** Has been able to act quickly, in response to COVID-19 • Following local safety procedures, as well as company program, including: Reconfigured some transfer station acceptance areas to limit contact Stopped accepting cash, except in emergency situations □ 2-man garbage routes are wearing masks when in cab ~50 employees, including Customer Service, are now working remotely ► Customer Service getting more calls about billing questions Commercial volumes have dropped 25-30% □ Almost a 1:1 offset with residential The transfer stations have been incredibly busy, with extremely long lines □ Put messaging out by news, social media, press releases, and placed signage, encouraging people to stay home ► April 2020 had 3,600 more transactions than April 2019 □ 1-2k tons less than last April ☐ Lines at the transfer stations have begun to return to normal Trying to catch up on some of the little projects Simone notes that several people from the community had voiced concerns and frustrations over the traffic CTS is a known issue, and the current situation has just made it worse □ There are already plans in place to change the entry/exit point
 - Local Waste Connections is not currently suspending service due to non-payments, but may need to move forward in a month or two.

Traffic cams have been placed at all three transfer stations, and messaging put out to

Signage has been placed to direct traffic, but have, in some cases been ignored

■ Took a \$85,000 hit from past due balances in April

encourage people to check the traffic before coming out

☐ Encouraging people to call and work with them regarding overdue balances

three months with no meetings

 Rich mentioned the 2 absence policy may have been instituted during a time that meetings were monthly, and may need a change for a quarterly format
 Improvements
 Simone recalls a previous SWAC member found it insightful to visit other county SWAC meetings and bring information back from them; and shared an example of member responsibilities from another county's SWAC
 Kyle likes the idea of SWAC field trips, to educate, as well as build member relationships
 Tim likes the idea of attending other SWAC meetings

- Travis mentions much of what is brought to SWAC is also discussed with the Regional Solid Waste Systems Steering Committee (made of Public Works representatives from the Clark County municipalities)
 - Tim asks if it makes sense for SWAC and RSWSSC to have some form of interaction
 - Unknown at this time, though the question can be brought to RSWSSC

V. Subcommittees – Kyle Potter (*01:18:48)

- ¿ Kyle would like to get someone to help Jason on the Legislative and Policy subcommittee
 - Kyle and Tim are both willing to help
 - May be good to get SWAC position on bills, so the subcommittee can act on behalf of SWAC, without having to run it by them first
- Recruitment subcommittee to help attract the right candidates to fill SWAC positions, and posting notices to the right groups, such as Leadership Clark County
 - Positions are typically posted as a news release, sent to SWAC & SWAC distribution list, posted on Next Door, Facebook, Instagram

- Some positions may be posted in additional areas as well
 - ☐ For the Agricultural position, Kim also reached out to the Farm Bureau and other related organizations
- Joe suggests placing recruitment notices at WSU College of Business
- o Simone suggests aligning outreach with community based organizations, to gain diversity
- Derek asks what are the main challenges we face in recruitment
 - The time commitment requirement
 - Reaching people who are interested in civic engagement
 - Competing with other advisory committees
 - Not many people aware of the need, or interested in helping
- Rich suggests offering the Council some candidates, as well as the subcommittee's recommendations
- Simone suggests creating a framework of what we are trying to accomplish
- Kim needs to know whether this subcommittee will be created, or move forward with the applicant, to give the information to the council tomorrow
 - ✓ Kyle motions to create this subcommittee, and re-post the open position
 - □ Unanimous approval
 - ☐ ! Steve will draft something for members to review
 - ▶ ! Travis will send Steven a copy of the PHAC recruitment process

VI. Regional System Study – Mike Davis (*01:43:29)

- Not yet ready to make comments on what has been received
 - o Many County reviews still pending
 - Expecting to work through some within the next couple of weeks
 - Financial review proved to be rather time consuming
 - WC is reviewing site info provided by JR Miller
 - Discussions of potential expansions at CTR
 - Behind where they had anticipated, but things are still coming together
 - Anticipating more finalized documents within the next month or two, which JR Miller will collate in a draft report
 - Anticipates a lot of discussions regarding self-haul options (Task 3)
 - SWAC will likely play a role in the outcome of this piece
 - Easily a month to a month and a half behind, due to COVID-19
 - o ¿ If there are any specific questions, route them to Kim, who will get them to Mike

VII. Other Business (*01:54:22)

- Simone recently attended an OR DEQ virtual workshop, on Workforce Development <u>"Repair & Reuse"</u> grants, and found it to be a great idea and possibility for WA state
 - o Geared toward small businesses and non-profits focused on repair and reuse
 - They are moving away from recycling, and looking into rebuilding their programs based on current conditions
 - Within our SWMP, a chapter talks about economic opportunities within recycling, including some analysis

VIII. Special Waste Project Update – Jessica Fischberg (*01:58:22)

- Residential battery recycling evaluation has been completed
 - o Includes report outlining challenges and solutions used by other regions
 - Currently working with Ops team, CoV, and WC to finalize report
 - Will likely have a presentation to share with SWAC

- Medication stewardship is about a month away from installing kiosks at pharmacies and law enforcement agencies
 - o Currently only a couple in Clark County, but hopeful to get more
 - o Includes free mail in pouches
 - May promote the mail in pouches during Stay-at-Home orders
