### **Surveys:**

- The initial survey launched in June and closed on August 31, 2020 (2,709 responses vs. 1,500 in 2014)
- Survey summary report review and edits: It is our goal to have this to you by 11/19/20
- The second survey launched on 11/3/2020
- We have 807 responses as of 3:30 pm 11/9/2020
- The online survey will close by midnight on 11/15 to allow time to review data and share with PAB
