Feb. 17 Annual Meeting Prep

- Chuck met with the Council Chair and County Manager to review the February meeting agenda.
- Public comment: the group confirmed it will be kept on the meeting agenda. If they are short on time, they can let members of the public know they can submit comments by email to the commission.
- ACTION ITEM: staff to double-check there is information on the commission's webpage on how to provide comments. This information will also be included in the meeting notification that goes out through the commission's email distribution list.
- Presentation to Council will include 2020 annual report and 2021 look ahead
- ACTION ITEM: staff to adjust wording on meeting agenda about interactive presentation.
- Addition to annual report take-aways: challenge/opportunity in coordinating and working together. Ex. of coordination is Clark County Food Bank collaborating withother service providers. Recommendation to look for opportunities to help make coordination easier.
- Example of service provider adaptation to highlight in annual report: Meals on Wheels elegant solution of weekly shelf-stable food delivery and phone connection service.
- The commission approved the annual report take-aways and directed staff to move forward and finalize the annual report
- Presentation approach: 1) staff to draft PowerPoint and script; 2) confirm presenters; 3) presenters can further edit script for their slides.
- Linda provided suggested ideas for 2021:
 - Housing: needs increase and become more acute the longer we are in the Pandemic. Rent, mortgage; payments, evictions, and an unknown future loom overhead...'

2021 focus proposal discussion: Impact of COVID-19 and the road to recovery for an aging population

The group agreed on the following 2021 work program

- Focus: Impact of COVID-19 and the road to recovery for an aging population
- Structure:
 - Monthly meetings
 - o No prepared presentations or slides
 - o Invite speakers to be interviewed/participate in roundtable discussion
 - o Format: share roughly 3-5 questions with speaker before meeting, one COA member will serve as the interviewer/moderator for each interview, will start the interview with prepared questions and then open up for roundtable discussion with COA members. Will also still take questions from members of the public. This is essentially the "Rotary Club Model"
 - o Goal is to leave each meeting with a recommendation or next step. Group can revisit recommendations/next steps at each meeting and build on them throughout the year.
 - o A few COA members are on point for each topic to refine monthly topic, identify speakers to invite, develop interview questions. One member of planning team will serve as the interviewer/moderator for that month. That person will help staff brief the guest and be invited to join the Chair and Vice Chair at their monthly prep meeting with staff.

- Franklin: recommended PhaseFinder application for COVID-19 vaccinations and noted that CDBG allocation of funds with City of Vancouver will likely be related to response to COVID-19 situation
- Nancy: received call from Aaron Marvin, a builder and member of the Building Industry Association (BIA) regarding interest in ADUs in the rural area for older residents. Suggested as topic to follow-up on at a future meeting.
- **Chuck:** ACTI Quarterly meeting: in the future, may bring grants in front of COA for resolution of support. The USDOT has its first accessibility transportation plan available for review and comment. Chuck will be filming a video with CVTV about COA, it will air in February.
