<b>SITE DESCRIPTION</b> (Discuss physical characteristics of proposed acquisition): Project site is primarily a floodplain wetland dominated by reed canarygrass but including some year-round ponds and stands of willow and Oregon Ash. Priority habitat and species designations include Biodiversity and Habitat Corridor and Waterfowl Concentrations. Site is a part of a state-designated Watchable Wildlife Area. Shoreline Master Plan designation is "Natural." Conservation Areas Acquisition Plan identifies the site as a high value conservation area.
<b>PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT IMPROVEMENTS:</b> Salmon habitat restoration. At some point in the future the East Fork Lewis Greenway Trail may be aligned through the project site.
<b>PROPOSED USES ON SITE:</b> Project is acquisition only. However, Salmon Habitat Restoration and a public trail are anticipated in the future.

Partnership contributions	The Lower Columbia Estuary Partnership is designing a salmon-habitat restoration project for the site and adjacent county property. Making the trail connection between downtown La Center and the Ilani Casino is a high priority for the City of La Center. Neither LCEP nor the City is contributing to the acquisition. However, the LCEP design is being supported with Bonneville Power Administration revenue and would be a strong candidate for construction funding, once the design is approved.
