CALL TO ORDER

I. Introductions

II. January 11, 2021, Meeting Minutes A motion was made by Jim Hodges to approve the minutes, seconded by David Scott, minutes approved.

III. HUD Funding Updates

Available funding has been calculated. With reprogrammed funds, CDBG has \$1,116,303 to allocate to applicants, and HOME has \$488,311. There is also a balance of \$459,185 of CDBG-CV funds that have not been allocated. The American Rescue Plan is expected to provide additional HOME dollars.

IV. 2021 Application Scoring and Selection

Based on scoring by the UCPB, a recommendation was provided to the board for consideration. David Scott motioned to accept the recommendation, seconded by Jeff Swanson and approved.

V. CDBG-CV3 Discussion and Selection

An update to the Battle Ground Health Care project was discussed. The original funding request was to provide rehab to their current building. The board originally awarded \$627,858. BGHC has since found a newer building in a more accessible location and can expand services by moving to a new location. They are requesting the balance of CDBG-CV3 funds of \$459,185, bringing the new total for the project to \$1,087,043. The total project cost is \$2,600,000 after an \$856,000 discount to the price. Remaining balance would be paid through a 15-year purchase option. CDBG-CV funds will be used to pay the first 5 years of payments and do some tenant improvements. **Cherish DeRochers motioned to accept the recommendation to allocate the remaining dollars for the program, seconded by David Scott, and approved.**

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VI. <u>Program Updates and Reports</u>

- Clark County is receiving U.S. Treasury funding for emergency rent assistance in the amount of \$14.7m, estimated to assist 2,200 households. Clark County is partnering with several nonprofit and affordable housing agencies to distribute the funds. The state is also providing \$15.4m for this program in Clark County, estimated to assist an additional 2,500 households. Waiting for additional guidance from Treasury.
- In 2020, Clark County Community Services received a grant from Washington State Department of Commerce to increase shelter capacity. This is a joint project with the City of Vancouver and Vancouver Housing Authority. The VHA acquired a former hotel near Vancouver Mall to serve as a non-congregate shelter. Catholic Community Services was selected as the operator for the shelter through a request for applications. The shelter is estimated to open in June. This will convert to permanent supportive housing in three years.
- An overview of the October-December 2020 quarterly reports was provided. Most projects are on schedule.
