<ul> <li>Communications / Announcements / Citizen Comments</li> <li>Dan, Doug, Jim, and Randy along with Amber testified this morning in the hearing for the transportation bill which includes \$12.5 million for the Chelatchie Railroad.</li> <li>Letters are going to County Councilors encouraging them to reinstate Senate Bill 5517. Dan has spoken with councilors and will continue to do that. It is time for RRAB to write a letter to Council recommending they go forward. Dan has started letter. Send Dan anything you would like included. Port of Vancouver is going to send a letter to the county manager.</li> <li>Dan and John met with some of the people from the Brush Prairie homeowner's association. They want to continue the discussion. Dan will attend the next quarterly board meeting. The group is concerned with safety and congestion that would come from an industrial area with heavy truck traffic.</li> <li>Shipping ballast from the Chelatchie Prairie is out in the future. A lot work needs to be done to the tracks before it is ready for unit trains with ballast.</li> <li>Eric has had inquiries from customers. If people get off the train it will need to be sprayed down before passengers get back on. May not be able to have passengers in caboose because of poor air flow.</li> <li>Also need enough of the public facing volunteers vaccinated to be able to run.</li> <li>Doug had a discussion with the director of the NW Railroad Museum in Snoqualmie about how to operate and maintain social distance. They have been doing it.</li> </ul>
