# Summer SWEO Updates: May – Aug. 2021

### **Operations**

- LSWFA 2021-23 grant cycle began on 7/01/21
  - \$1.3 million total
    - 75% State share
    - 25% County match
  - Plans for grant fund use include
    - Regional System Study
    - Solid Waste Management Plan update
    - Special Waste
    - Equity & Diversity
    - Contamination Reduction & Outreach Plan
    - Food Waste
    - Homeless Camp Cleanup
  - o 2019-21 grant cycle ended on 6/30/21
    - Finishing up reporting
- Several things happening regarding staffing
  - o Conducted interviews for Environmental Operations Specialist and Special Waste positions
    - Making a job offer on the Special Waste Position
      - Projects under this position (oil, anti-freeze, batteries, etc.) had been put on hold, but will resume upon start of new recruit
        - Will develop outreach/implementation for non-curb-side battery recycling
          - To be part of new recycling contract
      - Closing recruitment for Environmental Operations Specialist position to reevaluate the position
  - o Hoping to recruit for Green Schools and Program Assistant positions soon
  - AmeriCorps members for the 2021-22 cycle have been selected
    - Paperwork is still pending, but at present, the following is expected
      - Green Business: Abby
        - Focusing on food waste outreach, recycling resources deliveries and outreach, workshops, and networking events
      - Green Neighbors: Brittany
        - Focusing on WasteBusters Challenge, Natural Garden Tour, and coordination of Pacific Park community garden
      - Green Schools: Trudy
        - Focusing on School cafeteria visits and developing a food waste prevention and rescue program
- Regional System Study still moving along
  - Finalizing Phase 1
    - Should be available by the end of August
  - Will be working on a chapter for Materials Recovery Facilities (MRF) within the next week or so
    - Should finalize the following week

#### **Green Business**

- Two new certified business <u>Columbia Okura</u> and <u>Cascade Sprouts</u>
- There are 2 businesses (one with 3 sites in Clark County) currently working on certification.
- A virtual workshop event was held on May 13 about tracking progress and change. It was the third and final event in a 3-part series for green teams.

• Events are on pause for the summer and will start up again in September.

### **Green Neighbors**

- Single-family Recycling Outreach
  - o A "Keep Recyclables Loose" ad campaign ran in May and June.
    - Banner ads campaign delivered nearly 3 million impressions (2,917,520) and 2,519 clicks to the <a href="https://www.clarkgreenneighbors.org/recycling-done-right">www.clarkgreenneighbors.org/recycling-done-right</a> webpage
    - Connected TV ad campaign delivered 420,717 impressions with a completion rate of 98.3%
    - Audience targeting ad campaign delivered nearly 2.5 million impressions (2,496,803) and generated 2,510 clicks.
    - During the months of May and June, the <u>www.clarkgreenneighbors.org/recycling-done-right</u> webpage saw 791 pageviews, 731 unique pageviews, and an average time of 1:57 on the page.
  - Waste Connections Recycling Advocates put together a cart tagging report to submit to
    Department of Ecology for grant reimbursement. ("CT Grant Report\_2019-21" pdf handout)
- Multifamily Recycling Outreach
  - Final versions of the Door Tag and Multifamily Recycling Guide have been printed (previews available upon request)
  - Outreach is currently on pause until August 2021 for Waste Connections staff.
- Natural Lawn and Garden
  - The 2021 virtual Natural Garden Tour is live at <a href="www.clarkgreenneighbors.org/gardentour">www.clarkgreenneighbors.org/gardentour</a>. As of 7/23/21, we have over 1,000 views of our 13 videos. We had a "Gardener Panel" online event on July 19 with 35 attendees.
  - Backyard Habitat Certification Program has continued with site visits, and this past quarter certified 9 properties and have 37 in-progress.
  - The Master Gardeners hosted our first volunteer work party open to the public at the Natural Gardens as Pacific Park on Saturday, July 24.
  - August 16, 7 pm, online workshop: "Moonlight Moth Gardening: Supporting Moths in the Home Garden"
- Recycled Arts Festival
  - Virtual event to go live August 7. A selection of 13 artists will be featured in the story map along with videos, photos and written descriptions of their artwork.

#### **Green Schools**

- Hosted first ever Virtual Student Summits with EarthGen
  - Elementary and Middle School Summit
    - Total of 8 schools from around the state attended
    - Had a career panel, school green team presentations, and global environmental leaders and activists bingo
      - Career panel included a high school student green team leader and activist, a landscape architect, and water resources engineer
  - High School Summit
    - Total of 3 schools from around the state attended
    - Had a career panel, school green team presentations, and global environmental leaders and activists trivia
      - Career panel included a wind farm technician, a water resources engineer, and an urban naturalist with Seattle Parks and Rec

- 8 Clark County schools certified with EarthGen this year
  - Ellen and Sami were able to visit a few schools with EarthGen to celebrate their accomplishments
  - Schools certified include

- Database transition to Smartsheet
  - Current Google Drive database contains thousands of data entries that are taking up too much space and not working properly anymore
  - Transitioning to Smartsheet to streamline our school visit history, inventory and materials management, and school administration info
  - Will allow easier access for GS team members (Waste Connections and City of Vancouver)
- AmeriCorps
  - o Hiring a Green Schools AmeriCorps member for the 2021-2022 schoolyear
  - New term starts September 16<sup>th</sup>
- Materials Requests
  - Fulfilling school and school districts requests for new recycling and composting bins
  - Hoping to create a new barcode tracking system to maintain a better inventory
- Hockinson Blueberry Farm Tour
  - Hockinson School District and Chartwells are hosting a blueberry farm tour at <u>Majestic Farms</u>
    Blueberries on August 9<sup>th</sup>
  - o Pete and Sami will be hosting an educational table featuring worm bins and composting bins
  - Hoping to promote school garden composting
