


#### Finance Reports: Funding Expended by Fund Source

#### Finance Reports: Funding Expended by Service Type


Distribution of funding by type of service provided. Includes regular and COVID funds expended July-December 2021.

Distribution of funding by type of service provided. Compares regular and COVID funds expended July-December 2021.





#### Finance Reports: Revenue Fund Sources


Comparison of fund sources received between state, local and federal awards. Includes regular and COVID related funds. Allocation timelines vary.










# What subpopulations should the City prioritize for homelessness assistance?
