	QUESTION	ANSWER
1.	Cost proposal is listed #6 on the proposal content list (top of page 16 of the RFP) and then says "Cost will not be used as an evaluation criterion." Does this mean Clark County does not require a cost proposal? Or that is it just not part of the evaluation criteria but is still expected to be included in the proposal.	Clark County does not expect or desire a cost proposal with the RFP submittal. For an engineering/architectural contract, firms are ranked based on qualifications only. Costs would be developed and negotiated along with the detailed scope of work for a contract with the selected firm.
2.	How much support is anticipated from the environmental services consultant with regard to fish passage design or hydraulic modelling?	Fish passage design and hydraulic modeling will be provided by other consultants on the project teams. Support for these activities from the environmental services consultant is anticipated to consist of such work as environmental input regarding the design, review of plans from an environmental viewpoint, and incorporating the design as appropriate into the environmental documentation and permitting.
3.	Please confirm assumption: stormwater treatment design will be provided by the design consultant but with fish/bio input from the environmental consultant.	That is mostly correct: Stormwater treatment design will be provided by county designers, with support from the environmental consultant similar to that mentioned in the previous question.
