NPDES Phase 1 Municipal Stormwater Permit

State and Federal law

- Federal Clean Water Act EPA
- EPA delegates authority to Ecology
 - National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Stormwater Permit
 - Regulates discharges to waters of the state
 - Updated every 5 years current permit August 2019 – July 2024

Permit Compliance

- Led by Clean Water division
- Supported by multiple divisions and depts
- Numerous requirements and criteria

Compliance is important!

- Public health, water body health, and quality of life
- Fines and third-party lawsuits

Program Components/ Requirements

- Storm sewer inventory
- Code and manual updates
- Watershed planning
- Source control and illicit connections
- Stormwater capital projects
- Stormwater facility maintenance
- Coordination with other jurisdictions
- Surface water and stormwater monitoring
- Education and outreach

Local Framework and Regulatory Requirements

Primary Policy and Goals

Policy:

Meet Phase I Municipal Stormwater Permit requirements

Goals:

- Protect and enhance streams and wetlands
- Minimize stormwater impacts to receiving waters
- Maximize public benefits of county-owned lands

Regulatory Requirements

Phase 1 Municipal Stormwater Permit:

- Structural stormwater controls prevent or reduce impacts to waters of state
- Stormwater management planning
- Maintenance and operations

Underground Injection Control Program:

County must address any drywells that pose a threat to groundwater

- Reforestation
 - Schriber (Phase 2)
- Underground Injection Control
 - Country Meadows UIC (2023 completion)
- Property acquisition
 - Cedars golf course

Design - Five projects

Planning

- Tenny Creek/114th Tributary retrofits
- Reforestation planning






2023-2028 Priorities

- Required capital repair projects (>\$25,000)
- Water quality treatment in lower Salmon Creek tributaries (Cougar, Suds, Tenny, 114th Street)
- Reforestation of county lands
- Property acquisition for stormwater benefit
- Ongoing Programs
 - Reforestation planning
 - Drainage basin retrofit studies
 - Street sweeping



Project Types

30 projects 2 ongoing programs \$13.4 Million 2023-2028 Total

Orange: Funds spent through 2022



Funding



2022 Clean Water Adopted Budget

Total budget: \$10 million

Annual capital spending varies significantly based on project construction timelines



Leveraging

- Property acquisitions can qualify for capital credit (Legacy Lands, Clean Water)
- Reforestation program on county lands
- Heritage Farm wetlands restoration capital credit and completes a component of the farm master plan without using general fund dollars
- Combine required UIC retrofits at Country
 Meadows with completion of Northeast 99th Street
 in 2023
- Ongoing coordination with CRP to leverage opportunities and catch basin retrofits




Grants

2023-2028 Funding

Funding currently awarded toward two projects: \$1.1 million total

Current and future proposals

- October 2022 design proposal submitted for \$150,000
- ➤ Anticipate submitting construction proposals for 7 projects 2023-2026: \$4 million
