4) Announcement regarding Justin O'Dea and WSU Extension – Justin Collell

- a) Email from Justin O'Dea stating, "WSU has been asking me to refrain from the weed board meetings and some other meetings where I serve as an Ex-Officio and to move on to an "as-needed" basis, because my position is overloaded."
- b) Kevin asked Justin to attend the first meeting of each year, as the most important meeting of the year, since this ex-officio membership is in the statute. Justin said his position is overloaded but can be made available.
- c) Lisa concerned that county boards are being dismissed and Kevin explained that if there is a concern we need to reach out to WSU Extension

6) Adopt Clark County Noxious Weed List with specific language – Justin Collell

- a) Justin provided handout at end of minutes
 - i) Butterfly Bush language decision: Control is not mandated unless weeds are within 100 feet of a natural waterbody
 - ii) Canada thistle/bull thistle language decision: Control is not mandated unless weeds are within 100 feet of a neighboring property that is producing agriculture
 - iii) Eurasian watermilfoil language decision: Control is mandated unless weeds are within 100 feet of the Columbia River
 - iv) Meadow Knapweed control/language decision: Yes-control, Yes-use same language as Canada/bull thistle
 - v) Shiny Geranium control/language decision: Yes-control, Yes-Use same language as Canada/bull thistle

7) FIP Update – Justin Collell

- a) More to come on feral holly language
- b) Changes to weed list at the state level did not affect Clark County
- c) Variable-leaf milfoil (VLM) update:
 - i) DNA tests confirmed milfoil is not Eurasian
 - ii) Appears to be a hybrid of VLM and native western water milfoil
 - iii) State will decide if they want to list the hybrid as a class A
 - iv) Montana State University said the DNA tests are valid, but results could be a variation of the same species, and this could be a native plant doing something abnormal there is only one gene difference
 - v) Justin will coordinate with the State Weed Board and Department of Ecology as this is the first hybrid documented and may change what we commit to in the future
 - vi) Don asked how much harm the hybrid would cause, and Justin said he is very new to this plant sometimes Justin has observed these plants forming a monoculture and sometimes they don't spread across a whole pond.
- d) Tree-of-Heaven update:
 - i) Justin met with the City of Vancouver and other Citizen Scientists who are interested in responding to this invasive species
 - ii) Looking into next steps such as control work and what we can do to reduce the threat of Spotted Lanternfly and Tree-of-Heaven as well as using mapping data to mitigate risk
- e) FIP is still working on other items and there is a possibility of contracting with a different staffing agency for seasonal staff

Eurasian Watermilfoil: "Control is not mandated within 100 feet of the Columbia River."
