Project Background



The Comprehensive Plan

- Originally adopted in 1994 and last updated in 2016
- Plan is a long-range policy guide to manage growth and development over a 20-year period
- Growth Management Act (<u>RCW 36.70A.130</u>) requires jurisdictions to periodically review and update, if necessary, their Plan and development regulations to bring them up to date with:
 - Changes to state law,
 - Land use changes, if any,
 - Population and employment growth projections, and
 - Housing projections



Comprehensive Plan Elements

- Housing
- Capital Facilities
- Utilities
- Rural (for counties)
- Transportation
- Economic Development
- Parks and Recreation
- Shoreline
- Annexation
- Optional elements: schools, historic, community design





















Example of a Comprehensive Plan policy

The Comprehensive Plan of the county and each municipality shall identify sufficient land for housing, including, but not limited to, government-assisted housing, housing for low-income families, manufactured housing, multifamily housing and group homes and foster care facilities. All jurisdictions will cooperate to plan for a "fair share" of the region's affordable housing needs and housing for special needs population.










Example of Maps in the Comprehensive Plan
