

Fraud 2020 – by week.


What is "not normal"?

On any given week the red line shows the normal maximum number of fraud calls.


On any given week the orange line shows the normal average number of fraud calls.

On any given week the green line shows the normal minimum number of fraud calls.


On any given week the gray line shows 2019 fraud calls.

The standard measure of law enforcement in a community is "per 1,000 population"












In 2018 - 27% of calls were patrol initiated.

In 2022 – 18% of calls were patrol initiated






Priority 1 – Someone is hitting you with a bat

Priority 3 – Burglary, Vehicle Prowl, Shoplift







Priority 1 – Someone is hitting you with a bat


Most resource intensive of calls. CCSO (fully staffed) can only respond to two (2) priority l calls at one time.



















- In 2018 there was a large increase which coincides with the "Me Too Movement"
- In 99.9% of the reported rape cases in Clark County, the victim knew the offender.
- 50% to 70% of Rape cases involved alcohol or drugs by either the victim or the suspect.


*The presence of alcohol or drugs does not excuse or justify sexual assault.



- The pandemic saw a sudden decrease in robbery.
- In 2022 the most common type of "Robbery" has been when a shoplifter pushes or threatens a store loss prevention officer.
- Bank Robberies have decreased over the past decade.



Tensions during the pandemic likely lead to the increase in Aggravated assaults.



Simple Assaults have been relatively constant from year to year.


Violent Youth Crime

Youth = 12 to 24

Total Violent Crime has risen slightly.

The largest jump was from 2017 to 2018. 53% increase.


From 2018 to 2022 there has been a smaller 4% increase




The Lighter Orange are violent crimes not involving youth


The Darker Orange is youth-involved violent cases.

A youth is either a suspect or a victim in a violent case.



More than half of youth violent crime is DV related.









There has been an increase in non-dv youth Assaults, Homicides, and Robberies.

There has also been an increase in the use of firearms during these incidents


NA cases usually mean the suspect was unarmed. Hands / Feet / Fists were used in the assault or robbery.









Burglary





- Burglary and Larceny are both related to Organized Retail Theft.
- Organized Retail Theft is becoming more and more common.
- Organized Retail Theft is when a single individual or group shoplifts thousands of dollars in merchandise and then converts the stolen items into cash.

Motor Vehicle Theft



- Most stolen vehicles are recovered within 72 hours.
- The most common vehicles stolen are Honda Civics / Accords and Ford F250 trucks.
- Most vehicles are used for transportation and shelter.
