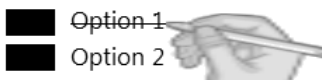

If you are mailing your ballot, it must be postmarked no later than Election Day, Tuesday, April 25, so check the pick-up schedule on the mailbox to confirm Election Day hours with the post office.

If you are returning your ballot by using an official ballot drop box, it must be deposited no later than 8:00 pm on Election Day, Tuesday, April 25, for it to be counted.

#### **Washougal School District No. 112-6 Proposition No. 12**

#### **Replacement Educational Programs and Operations Levy**

The Board of Directors of Washougal School District No. 112-6 adopted Resolution No. 2022-23-05, concerning a proposition to finance educational programs and operation expenses. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, replacing an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, to maintain current educational program funding levels and support the District's educational programs, student services and operations expenses not funded by the State of Washington:

Proposition No. 13**

**Replacement Capital Levy for Educational Technology,  
Health and Safety Improvements**

The Board of Directors of Washougal School District No. 112-6 adopted Resolution No. 2022-23-08, concerning a proposition to finance educational technology, health and safety improvements. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, replacing an expiring levy, on all taxable property within the District, to acquire and install educational technology equipment and infrastructure and provide technology support, upgrade building access controls, make ADA accessibility improvements, replace/repair boilers and roofs, and modernize flooring:

**Replacement School Support Levy for Educational  
Programs and Operations**

The Board of Directors of Woodland School District No. 404 adopted Resolution No. 23-01 concerning the replacement of an expiring school support levy. This proposition provides funding for educational programs and operations not funded by the State. If approved, Proposition 1 will authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, on all taxable property within the District, all as provided in Resolution No. 23-01:
