Industry Updates (10 minutes) 9:15 – 9:25	 WSU Extension planning to restart PIC training this summer; Fred Meyer has utilized NEHA for employee CFPM training and testing. Undergoing update of refrigeration alarm system. Clark County Food Bank is CFPM exempt but utilizes a Safe Food Bank training for staff and volunteers. Opening new warehouse facility in Fall for processing pre-packaged food.
	CFPM conversation: attendees report using approved CFPM testing and certification providers or meeting exempt status. Reminders provided that the presence of a PIC is always required. PIC is different than CFPM. PIC is knowledgeable of food safety practices occurring at the point and time and demonstrates active managerial control; CFPM responsibilities include providing training to the PIC and should help develop policies and procedures.
