4) FIP Updates - Justin Collell

- a) Staff is watching for Tansy to bolt we have enough signs to put out but may need to replenish for next year
- b) Blackberry/Ivy Flyer (attached) Property owner in Camas received flyer and called our office as it suggests Clark County controls blackberry and ivy Our office emailed the City of Camas, CPU, Camas Ivy League and the Lacamas Shores HOA, all of which responded saying they had not seen the flyer previously
- c) Home and Garden Idea Fair Booth was consistently busy with very good outreach
- d) Variable-leaf Milfoil Identified six parcels in addition to Warren Seely with VLM and if there is money left over after treating Warren Seely we will treat some or all of those parcels We have received information back from contractors and will also submit the application for aquatic herbicide with DOE It takes time to receive the permit and then it can be passed to the contractor There is a 30 day comment period so the soonest treatment can happen is June 12th Product is ProcellaCOR Treatment will be coordinated with Townsend Farms as they have water rights to Warren Seely for blueberry crop
- e) Staff doing great job with class A weeds and Poison hemlock John Wilson back May 3rd Justin has been in contact with Slenderflower thistle property owners early contact via reminder letters will be helpful for customer service calls and landowners are scheduling contractors earlier

- a) Bill Zimmerman asked about challenges with property owners and if there is a short list of those that look bad Justin explained that it differs year to year
- b) Randy Lawffer asked about warning letters and Justin explained that historic as well as new infestations can receive warning letters Some historical sites can also go straight to violation which requires control within 10 days

6) Public Comment

- a) Rennie Kubik commented about Tree-of-heaven and Justin mentioned that some people like it for the foliage and the shade and that it's not designated for control – he also said WA state has an interest in mapping/controlling it due to the Spotted Lanternfly – Clark County participated in the mapping – Rennie asked if a map was available to the public and Justin will see about getting a link to the data set on our webpage
- b) Rennie Kubik asked about Canada thistle and that some neighbors don't think it's a bad weed Justin commented that we can only enforce control when it impacts agriculture, and our office is happy to send information to property owners
