#### **CCPH Strategic Planning**

Roxanne Wolfe summarized the Clark County Public Health (CCPH) strategic planning process that has recently kicked off internally. There are various inputs to the department strategic plan, including the external work happening through the Community Health Assessment (CHA) and Improvement Plan (CHIP) steering committee engagement. The plan will be finalized by the end of the year along with the CHIP. PHAC members expressed the importance of understanding department and community priorities. The January PHAC meeting will be dedicated to reviewing and discussing the final plans.

PHAC input is important to the strategic plan, it will help us inform updates to our strategic plan and vision. Hayley Pickus facilitated an activity for PHAC members to share responses to four prompts around the CCPH vision statement. Notes from the activity will be forwarded to the Rede Group, the consulting firm supporting CCPH on the CHA, CHIP and strategic plan, for inclusion in the planning process.

- 1) Does the vision statement capture your hopes for Clark County?
- 2) How have or should we be making progress towards this vision?
- 3) What are challenges we see in the next three years to realizing this vision?
- 4) What are opportunities that if leveraged, could advance progress towards this vision?


