Approval of December 14, 2023, meeting minutes

The minutes were approved following a motion by Bob Nichols that was seconded by Kelly Jones.

Committee Reports

Appeals: None

Policies and Procedures: Section 2.3 extends unexcused absence notification and termination to members at large. Section was approved on voice vote.

Section 4.3-Terms of Office, clarifies that members may serve up to three years in each position of chair and vice chair, and may be reelected following an elapsed year. Motion made by Bob Nichols was seconded by Kelly Jones and passed.

WDVA update (David Puente)

State Veteran Homes offering skilled nursing are located in Spokane, Orting, Walla Walla, and Port Orchards. Eligibility is extended to eligible veterans, families of eligible veterans, and gold star parents. Two facilities also offer transitional

housing to get veterans employed and housed. The state veteran cemetery is located in Medical Lake. Armed forces license plates support the cemetery. Research is being done to identify a location for a second cemetery. Veterans' services include: service officers to file claims, the homeless veteran reintegration program (HVRP) case management to employability and economic security, veterans innovation program, transitioning warrior program, apprenticeship coordination, estate management, military transition and readiness, veteran owned business certification, LGBTQ+ outreach, military spouse outreach, women veteran programs, and call centers. WDVA offers counseling, TBI, and suicide prevention programs. The strategic planning process will continue for 4-5 years. HB1925 is being considered in legislature to provide additional funding for rural counties to have VSO services provided. HB2014 is proposing a change to the state definition of veteran.

Burial Benefits and Costs (Chris Castro)

Honorably discharged veterans, their spouses, and children up to age 18, are allowed to be buried in a veteran cemetery. A memorial marker or medallion is included. Arrangements are made at time of death, so family members may not be placed adjacent. National cemeteries do not allow a graveside service. Burial at sea is also available. Flags are available on request. A presidential memorial certificate is offered. Full military honors are included. Family can receive reimbursement for some expenses. Veterans' benefits may be available up to two years after passing, with proof of service, marriage certificate, receipts, death certificate, and other documentation. Costs average \$8,000-\$10,000.

November 2023, Contractor & Fund reports

The fund assisted 63 Veteran households. The Veterans Assistance Center received 601 veteran visits. The Free Clinic billed \$719 for 2 veterans. The Fund balance was \$763,205.

Veterans Assistance Center (VAC) Update

- 38 veterans were buried/cremated in 2023 at the cost of \$68,000.
- The Center received over 2100 visits and phone calls every month in 2023.
- Feb. 14 Bingo at Elks Lodge on McGillvray. Cards can be purchased from the CCVAC website.

Old Business

 meeting.
- Lloyd Bowman was approved as member at large following a voice vote.
