Staff have begun planning for 2025.</li> <li>Solid Waste development reviews</li> <li>Update on development projects.</li> <li>Staff is preparing to review the development code as part of the Comprehensive Plan update, work to start in 2025.</li> <li>2025 Solid Waste Rates</li> <li>2025 Rates Adopted: New rates eff. Jan 1, 2025. Vancouver's garbage rates will increase by 2.3-3.1%, and recycling/organics rates will increase by 2.3%. Rates were impacted by a 2.58% by CPI/fuel index and a 4.6%</li> </ul>
What Out of the	increase in disposal tip fee. A pass-through County recycling processing surcharge will adjust slightly in 2025 to: \$1.42/Single Family household/mo and Multifamily: \$0.66/unit/mo.
Waste Connections - Derek Ranta	<ul> <li>Finishing rates for the 2025 increase between 1-5 %.</li> <li>The hauling side moved into the new building, adding about 40,000 office and shop space.</li> <li>Maintaining a robust winter weather program to make sure customers are serviced and drivers are safe. Working with the county to communicate clearly with customers.</li> <li>The transfer station tonnage is slowing down for the year.</li> <li>New CRC contract, excited to have a new and relevant contract.</li> <li>Bike build with Waste Connections – They are building a little over 700 bikes this year.</li> </ul>
