Item IV. UCPB Application-Funding Guidelines (action)

- Policy update: Contingency Fund Guidelines
 - To help with timeliness issues
 - By including in the award process, reduces administrative requirements to move forward with that project quickly if needed
- Recommended addition
 - I. During the funding selection process the application from each category scored the highest by the UCPB that did not receive funding will be considered a contingency application and included in the Annual Action Plan submitted to HUD. If funding becomes available during the program year, the highest ranked contingency application that meets the funding criteria and can move forward with the funds will be provided funding.
 - If a funded activity is rescinded by the applicant or deemed ineligible to move forward by September 30 of the funding year, staff will move to the eligible contingency application.
 - Funds from funded activities that are rescinded or deemed ineligible to move forward after the September 30 deadline will be included in the next RFA allocation.



Item V. HUD Funding (info)

The following shows Clark County's estimated U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development grant allocations for program year 2025. Congress has yet to pass a 2025 budget; federal programs are working under a continuing resolution based on 2024 funding through March 14, 2025. The entitlement amounts below are our best estimate based on information available and 2024 awards.

What if scenarios? (action)

Minor Reduction

- Reduce the lowest scoring applications
- Verify projects/programs can still move forward with reduced award

Standing operating procedure

Major Reduction

- Voting cannot be conducted via email
 - Violation of OPMA
- Will reconvene UCPB if deadline for submitting AAP is extended
 - Not enough time for public comment if delay to April meeting
- Option 1: Fund according to scores (standing operating procedure)
- Option 2: Reduce all awarded applications proportional to funding reductions
- Option 3: Schedule emergency UCPB meeting



Item VI. Funding Recommendations (action)

- Starting with Affordable Housing & Homelessness because:
 - 1. TBRA programs effect the amount of CDBG funds available, and
 - 2. Not enough funding for all applications
- Can approve each funding category independently or all in one motion, whichever the board agrees on
- CDBG and HOME funds have specific allowable activities and cannot be easily moved between categories
- Staff recommendations are used to start conversation and not intended to sway the board
