SWEO Updates Solid Waste Education and Outreach Over 40 tons of food scraps were collected through the We - Sarah Keirns Compost community hub pilot program YTD. In May, staff completed our 2024 Secure Your Load partnership with Ecology by collecting data on incoming secured and unsecured loads at Central and West Van one year following the campaign. SWEO Staff, along with our Composter Recycler volunteers, engaged over 2,000 people through tabling at community events, through our Composter Recycler Workshops, and presentations at neighborhood association meetings. Green Awards celebration was held on May 29th.

Organizations/businesses awarded for their green business practices – Winners included PeaceHealth Southwest

Washington Medical Center, Simply Thyme Catering, TSMC Washington, and Evergreen Habitat for Humanity. Work on the annual Fall Mailer going out to residents is underway; county staff are supporting WCW efforts. The SWEO team is engaged in a significant overhaul of our web content. The project kicked off this month and will continue through the end of the year.
