Good Morning.

Thank you for the notification of peak operations at Livingston Mountain between August 26th through August 30th. I have copied the public works director in my reply. As we discussed last week the community development department will be monitoring and reporting all mining operation records to ensure compliance with our Contract and the related Conditional Use Permits for Livingston Mountain quarries. As such, in addition to the agencies and offices you currently provide reports to, please provide copies of daily truck trip counts with in and out times and loaded weight to my office at the end of each workday. I also need the name and contact number of a mine supervisor who can respond directly to public inquiries or reports of mining related issues (dust, noise, truck speed or accident, etc.). It is also important for us to track the removal of the remainder of the material from the County's quarry. Thus, on a weekly basis we will require a report that lists the total volume (tonnage) and type of material removed from the County's quarry, and the total amount left to be removed.

I will be meeting with the compliance coordinator later today and would like an opportunity to visit the Livingston Mountain quarries this week to meet the site supervisor(s) and tour the quarries. We would prefer to visit after the last truck out for the day if possible. Do you have a preferred day of the week for a site visit?

Mitch,

I sent a notice to Ahmad earlier this afternoon, but after learning he is out of town this is headed your way!

By contract I am required to "provide notice to the County the Friday before any intended peak operations. The notice must state the requested duration of use (which is limited to 5 calendar days per notice) and the number of requested trips. During properly noticed conditional "peak" operations, Tower may utilize an additional seventy (70) loaded trips per day, resulting in a total limit of one hundred and forty (140) trips per day."

This is my notice that next week I intend to be operating at peak (Monday, August 26 through Friday, August 30). This will result in an additional 70 loads per day totaling to a maximum 140 loads daily throughout the week.

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Mitch,

Per the contract:

Section 8 discusses my reporting requirements, I shall provide tickets every Monday for the week prior. In your opinion, is this longer sufficient? It seems requiring a daily delivery of tickets is superfluous.

Section 9 discusses my requirements on rock removal of State-owned material. Above that, the Plan of Operations requires 15 day notice to DNR prior to beginning to process and sell any State-owned material. After notice is given, strict reporting requirements follow. I would offer to extend that notice to Clark County rather than a weekly report of unchanged conditions in that regard for quite some time.

I believe a site meeting will be beneficial for the County so that the sequence in operations makes more sense. At that time, once it is understood, let's discuss methods of reporting information that is lately being asked of me. I'm available this week, but tomorrow would work best for me.
