BACKGROUND: The East Fork of the Lewis River upstream from Daybreak Park has been identified as a high priority stream segment for the successful recovery of protected salmon and steelhead. Stream habitat in this area is degraded and water quality, specifically temperature, is impaired. This project will restore important fish habitat and improve water quality in the area by shaping the channel, adding logs for fish habitat, and planting trees near the stream for shade. The construction documents are complete and we are ready to advertise the contract for bids. The advertisement is contained in the attached "Notice to Contractors". Public Works is providing Environmental Services construction bidding and management services for the project.

<u>COMMUNITY OUTREACH</u>: The proposed project was originally identified in the Lower East Fork Lewis River Aquatic Habitat Restoration Plan, adopted by the Lower Columbia Fish Recovery Board in 2009. The plan was prepared with the active involvement of the 19-member East Fork Lewis River Working Group, including representatives from local, state, and federal agencies, non-profit conservation organizations and citizens. Invitations to public meetings to review and solicit input on the draft plan were sent to all landowners owning land adjacent to waterways in the Lower East Fork Lewis River Basin. Written comments were also accepted from all interested parties prior to consideration of the draft plan by the Lower Columbia River Fish Recovery Board.

BUDGET AND POLICY IMPLICATIONS: Project funds are included in the approved 2013-2014 Legacy Lands budget. In March of 2010 the Board of County Commissioners authorized execution of Salmon Recovery Funding Board grant #09-1367 to develop preliminary designs for the project (final staff report SR 48-10). In March of 2012, the Board of County Commissioners authorized execution of Salmon Recovery Funding Board grant #11-1313 to prepare final designs and construct the project (final staff report SR 42-12). Grant funds cover 83.5% of the total project cost, with matching funds coming from the county's Conservation Futures Fund. This project supports recommended actions in the adopted Lower Columbia River Fish Recovery Plan, as well as Environmental Services goals of enhancing and protecting natural resources on county-owned properties.

The Board of County Commissioners authorized execution of grant agreement 11-1313 in March 2012 to prepare final designs and construct the salmon habitat enhancement project. Approval of the subject staff report would authorize the advertisement of bids to contractors for construction services needed to complete the project.

II.A - Describe the type of revenue (grant, fees, etc.)

Revenue for the project comes from grant agreement 11-1313R with the State Recreation and Conservation Office. The county is responsible for a 16.5% match of project expenses funded through the Conservation Futures Fund. In 2012, approximately \$42,000 was spent on the project and \$21,740 in reimbursements were received from the state. Should issuance of the Notice to Contractors be approved and the project constructed, additional grant reimbursement of \$189,377 is anticipated. The balance of the local match required by the executed grant agreement is \$21,682. The project is scheduled for completion in the 2013-14 biennium.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that sealed bids will be received until 1:50 P.M. on Tuesday, March 26, 2013, by the Clark County Board of County Commissioners through the General Services Purchasing Department, 1300 Franklin Street, Suite 650, Vancouver, Washington 98660, for the <u>Upper Daybreak Stream Habitat Enhancement (EF16), WO No. 028377</u>; and other work; then publicly opened and read aloud at the Commissioners' Hearing Room, 6th Floor of the Public Service Center, 1300 Franklin Street, Vancouver, Washington 98660, at 2:00 P.M. on Tuesday, March 26, 2013, or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard.

This project will enhance the outlets of two side-channels to improve fish habitat. Improvements will include re-grading the channel, adding log structures to the streambed for fish habitat and planting riparian vegetation.

Primary bid items: Roadway Excavation (Incl. Haul); Work Area Isolation, Imported Logs, Constructed Streambed (Installation Only), Plant Installation, Plant Establishment

will not be addressed. Questions too late to be answered as of that posting will remain unanswered and will not be included in the log.

All bids shall be delivered to the attention of the Clark County Purchasing, P.O. Box 5000, Vancouver, Washington 98666-5000 or 1300 Franklin Street, Suite 650. Bids shall be placed in a sealed envelope, marked "Sealed Bid", which clearly states the name of the bidder, the project number, the project title, the date of the bid opening, and appropriate wording to indicate definitely the nature of the contents. Do not send bids by FAX or email. Bids submitted by FAX or email will not be accepted.

A bid proposal deposit, made in the form of a certified check, cashier's check, or surety bond in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the amount of the bid proposal, shall accompany all bid proposals. Should the successful bidder fail to enter into such contract and furnish satisfactory performance bond within the time stated in the specifications, the bid proposal deposit shall be forfeited to the Clark County Road Fund.

The right is reserved by the Clark County Board of County Commissioners to waive informalities in the bidding, accept a proposal of the lowest responsible bidder, reject any or all bids, republish the call for bids, revise or cancel the work, or require the work to be done in another way if the best interest of the Contracting Agency is served.
