An Ordinance relating to Clark County Parks Advisory Board; amending Sections 2.61.050 and 2.61.070 of the Clark County Code to increase the number of members, and revise the selection criteria for members, of the Clark County Parks Advisory Board.

13 14 15 16 17	(a) Voting members. The Clark County Parks Advisory Board shall consist of five (5) seven (7) voting members, who reside within the boundaries of unincorporated Clark County, and who shall be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners to serve without compensation.				
18 19 20 21 22	(b) Ex-Officio Members. Each school district with territory within the boundaries of unincorporated Clark County, and the Parks Foundation of Clark County, may be represented at all board meetings; they may take part in all discussions of matters before the board, but shall not have a vote.				
23 24	(c) No Conflict of Interest. No member of the Clark County Parks Advisory Board shall be employed in connection with parks services, including parks construction and planning,

- or otherwise employed by Clark County in a paid capacity, during his or her term on the board.
  - (d) Representation on board. In filling vacancies, consideration should be given to ensuring representation of the broad range of interests related to parks in the community:
    - i. Board members should be knowledgeable about one or more aspects of Clark County Parks (e.g., trails, sports leagues, etc.) or willing to become appropriately knowledgeable and conversant about parks and issues.
    - ii. Board members should be broadly representative of the different neighborhoods and areas served by Clark County Parks.
    - iii. Board Members should be representative of the diversity in the community. Any form of discrimination based on race, color, religion, creed, sex, national origin, age, marital status, the presence of any sensory, mental, or physical disability or the use of a trained dog guide or service animal by a disabled person, sexual orientation/gender identity, veteran's status or any other status protected by law is prohibited. (Sec. 2 of Res. 1979-07-103)
- 42 Section 2. Amendatory. Sec. 2 of Res. 1979-07-103, as most recently amended by Sec. 7 of Ord. 2014-06-04, and codified by CCC 2.61.070, are each hereby amended to read as follows:

## 2.61.070 Meetings, officers and bylaws

The Clark County Parks Advisory Board shall:

- (a) Elect its officers each year in December, including a chairman, vice chairman and secretary, and such other officers as it may determine it requires. The secretary shall have charge of all records and shall keep accurate and complete minutes of all meetings. The term of office for each officer shall run until the subsequent election, provided that vacancies shall be filled for the remaining term of office.
- (b) Hold regular public meetings at least quarterly. Special meetings may be held as often as the board deems necessary. All meeting dates, agendas, and minutes will be posted on the Clark County webpage.
- (c) Adopt rules for transaction of business and shall keep a written record of its meetings, resolutions, transactions, findings and determinations, which record shall be a public record.
- (d) Meet at least once annually with the board of county commissioners.
- (e) Have a majority of its sitting members as a quorum for the transaction of business, but three four (4) affirmative votes are required to approve any action of the board. (Sec. 2 of Res. 1979-07-103)
