REQUEST: Approve Declaration of Emergency for Falls Road Culvert Repair

PUBLIC WORKS GOALS:

- X Provide safe and efficient transportation systems within Clark County
- X Improve environmental stewardship and protection of natural resources

BACKGROUND: Falls Road is located east of the Town of Yacolt and leads to residential and forest lands in northeastern Clark County. Weaver Creek passes under Falls Road via a 36" culvert at the bottom of a deep fill section. This old culvert is now collapsing and will not be able to carry winter creek flows. The culvert is in imminent danger of total collapse with the road fill then being washed out by the stream. The culvert must be repaired as soon as possible to avoid the loss of Falls Road, downstream property damage, environmental destruction and impacts to public safety. In addition, Falls Road serves about a dozen homes on the east side of the culvert that will be cut off should the culvert/embankment fail.


COMMUNITY OUTREACH: The Washington State Department of Natural Resources, whose property abuts the road, and the Weyerhaeuser Corporation, who log nearby lands, have been advised of the emergency situation. Residents, school bus operators and emergency service providers who use (or may use) Falls Road have been, or will be, notified prior to any repairs taking place.

BUDGET AND POLICY IMPLICATIONS: None. Project is included in the Adopted 2014 Annual Construction Program (ACP), Item #22 - Road Preservation Program.





DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY
DUE TO FAILED CULVERT ON FALLS ROAD

Resolution No. 2014-09-13

A RESOLUTION declaring a local emergency pursuant to Clark County Code 2.48.070; authorizing emergency procurements pursuant to Clark County Code 2.48.100; and waiving competitive bidding requirements pursuant to RCW 39.04.280.

WHEREAS, the crushed/failed culvert carrying Weaver Creek under Falls Road is in danger of imminent total collapse; and

WHEREAS, the culvert collapse will lead to washout of the Falls Road fill with disastrous consequences including the loss of Falls Road, downstream property damage, environmental destruction and impacts to public access and safety; and

WHEREAS, under the above referenced conditions there is a real and immediate threat that will likely result in material loss or damage to property or bodily injury unless immediate actions are taken to reduce the threat; and

WHEREAS, the conditions stated above constitute an emergency or disaster, necessitating the utilization of emergency powers granted pursuant to RCW 36.40.180, 38.52.070(2), and 38.52.110(1).

NOW THEREFORE, we the Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, Washington, do hereby resolve as follows:


To declare a local emergency and for projects that require immediate response to combat such emergency to protect the health and safety of persons, property and the environment, and provide emergency assistance to the victims of such emergency, County departments and officers are authorized to enter into contract and incur obligations and the requirements for competitive bidding are hereby waived pursuant to RCW 39.04.280. This authorization shall terminate at the close of business on December 31, 2014.

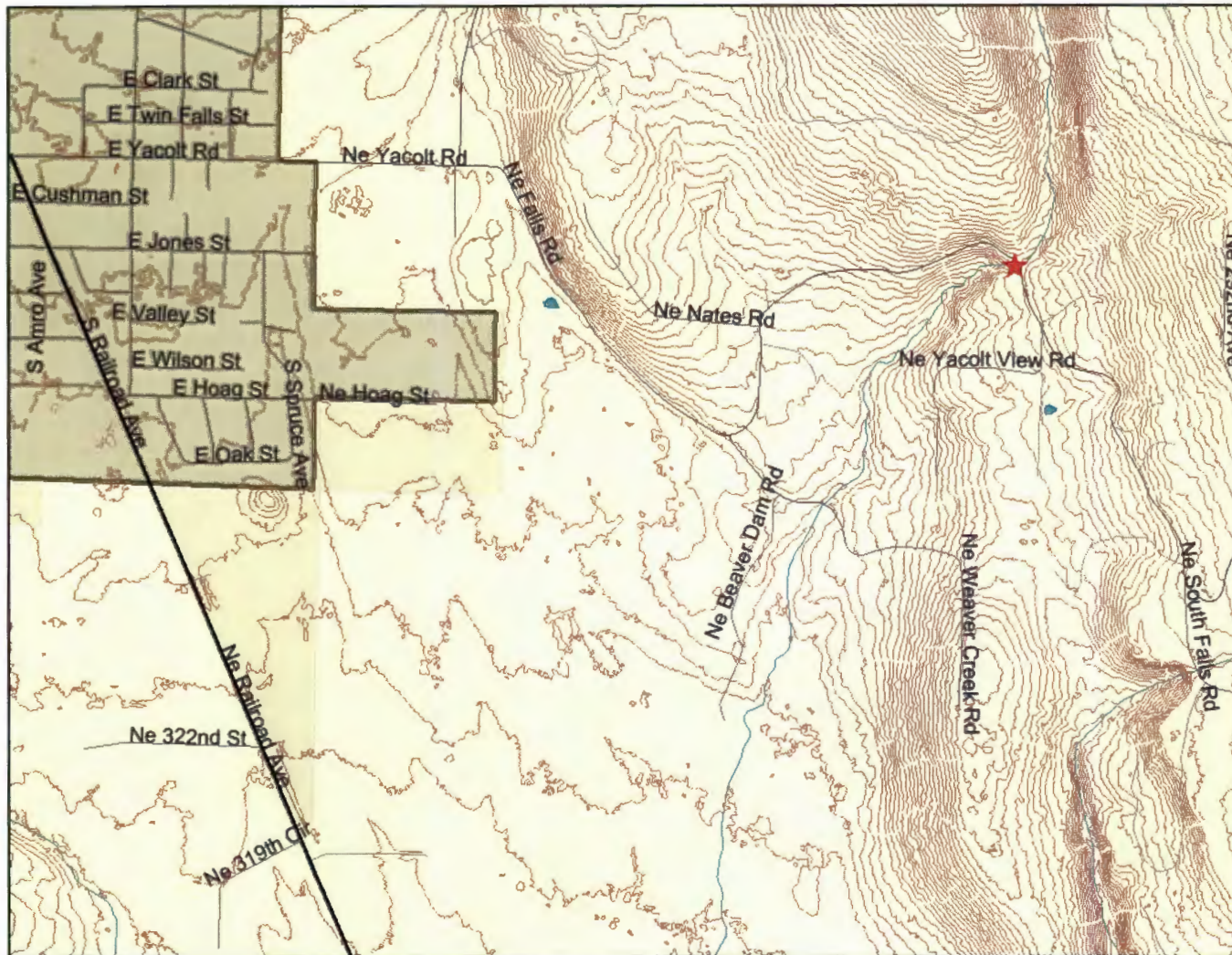
