BACKGROUND

Salamander, an asset tracking and resource management software system, was purchased with Federal Homeland Security grant funds received from the Washington State Department of Health, with the specific intent that its use would be shared among the emergency management and public health agencies within Region IV.

Given the continually declining public health preparedness funding, it is not fiscally possible for Public Health to maintain the Salamander equipment and service agreements. CRESA can fiscally support this capability, and transfer of this equipment will benefit all Region IV responders.

Clark County Equipment Transfer Agreement

This agreement is made and entered into this first day of March, 2014 by and between CLARK COUNTY, a political subdivision of the state of Washington, hereinafter referred to as County, and CRESA, hereinafter referred to as Agency.

WHEREAS, County is in receipt of an asset tracking and resource management software system, Salamander, purchased with Federal Homeland Security grant funds received from the State of Washington, Department of Health.

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that an appropriate agreement be executed for the transfer of equipment from County to Agency for the purpose of regional preparedness and response;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed by and among each and all of the parties hereto as follows:

- 1. County shall transfer the following equipment to Agency:
 - a) Salamander software.

Clark Regional Emergency Services Agency

- b) Salamander equipment and supplies (specific list in attached document, Exhibit A).
- 2. County shall track the software and equipment through it's useful life.
- 3. Agency will provide County access to the equipment when requested to complete required federal inventory reports.
- 4. Agency shall receive equipment 'as is' with the understanding that the County disclaims all warranties for the delivered equipment. Should the equipment not perform as specified by the vendor, the County will provide all warranty repair information to Agency if applicable.
- 5. Agency is responsible for all training related to the proper use, care and maintenance of the delivered equipment.
- 6. Agency shall account for and return any and all software and equipment when Agency discontinues the use of such equipment and or in the event either party terminates the agreement.
- 7. This agreement shall be effective until either party terminates the agreement by providing 30 days written notification.
