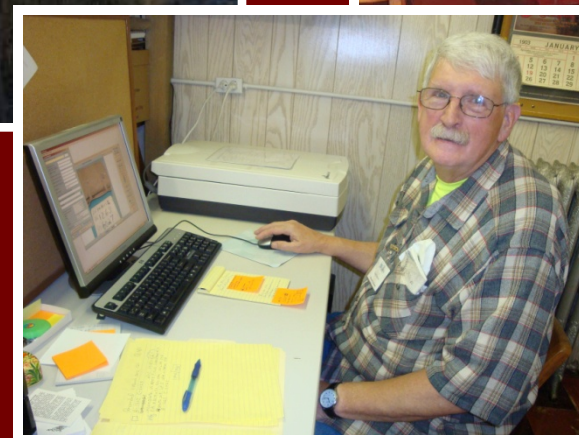
How Has the Public Gotten Involved ?
