#### BACKGROUND

In April of 2012, per the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit, the County established additional erosion control requirements on construction projects, including inspections and fees. Given this was a newly created program, a provision was added to periodically review the revenue/cost data to ensure appropriate fee charges. County Staff joined with members of the Development Engineering Advisory Board (DEAB), and over the course of several meetings (August/September 2014) reviewed the implications and results of the program, including costs. Of the 172 projects in process and/or completed over the past three construction seasons, it was realized revenue was out-pacing costs, and a reduction appeared in order, especially for smaller sized projects. Savings were largely attributed to contractor compliance, and construction inspection efficiencies (such as coupling erosion control inspections with other needed site inspections). In summary the proposal is to reduce the base fee from \$450 to \$350, and to reduce inspection fees on sites up to 5 acres by 50%. The proposal is supported by DEAB and the Public Works Director.

#### COUNCIL POLICY IMPLICATIONS

This action proposes a refinement of existing policy. It requires a change to county code 6.110A.035 – NPDES Erosion Control Inspection Fees.

#### PREVIOUS REVIEWS AND ACTIONS

DEAB reviewed and approved this recommended change at public meetings, as noted above, and gave their final review/approval on October 2, 2014.

#### COMMUNITY OUTREACH

DEAB brought this recommendation forward in public meetings on August 7 and October 2. Minutes from the meetings are on the County's webpage. The hearing was advertised on December 24, 2014, in The Reflector newspaper.

Notes:

1 NPDES erosion control inspection fees are in addition to development inspection fees in Table 6.110A.030.

2 The inspection permit year for erosion control begins on the date of the preconstruction conference. If no preconstruction conference is held, the permit year begins when fees are paid.

3 The disturbed area fee calculation adds the fee component from each applicable area range. The fee formula calculates the area in acres using two significant figures after the decimal point. For example, the fee for a project with 200 acres of disturbed area is \$17,344 (17,344=350+94+1,000+1,400+9,500+5,000)

4 Disturbed area is defined in Clark County Code Section 40.385.010(D).

5 "Erosion Control Inspections" are initially valid for one year. Extensions at a reduced rate are allowed if fees are paid before the expiration date. Projects with expired annual erosion control inspection permits shall pay the full fee and may be subject to code enforcement action.
