BACKGROUND

Each year the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) offers various equipment grants. One such grant focuses on providing equipment that enhances local traffic unit goals and objectives. This year, the Sheriff's Office submitted an application for various equipment needs. WASPC approved \$8,400 in funding for six radar units and six vehicle antennae. This equipment will assist the Sheriff's Office Traffic Unit in enforcement of motor vehicle speed laws and school-zone safety laws.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

There are a number of statewide and national traffic safety initiatives that use media messages and aggressive traffic law enforcement to encourage careful defensive driving and make our roads safer for those who travel them. This grant will help the Sheriff's Office to participate more fully to meet our residents' expectations in this regard.

BUDGET AND POLICY IMPLICATIONS

This grant award is resource neutral and entails an \$8,400 increase in both revenues and expenditures. An \$8,400 supplemental budget adjustment is necessary to recognize the revenues and expenditures associated with this grant in the 2015-16 budget. In recognition of the established schedule, this supplemental action request will be postponed to the next scheduled supplemental process.


