#### **BACKGROUND**

The Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO) provides leadership, funding, and technical assistance to help build community athletic fields via the Youth Athletic Facilities (YAF) grant program. The YAF grant program provides money to purchase land and renovate outdoor athletic facilities serving youth.

In order to apply for YAF grant funding, the Board must sign and approve resolutions authorizing submission of applications to the RCO for YAF grant funding assistance. Staff intends to submit two applications for two different projects. Two resolutions are attached to this report: one for Luke Jensen Sports Park, and one for Hockinson Meadows Community Park.

The Luke Jensen Sports Park project application to RCO asks for grant funding to install additional field lighting. The total expected project expense for the project is \$150,000. \$75,000 of this expense would be covered by RCO grant funding, if awarded. Vancouver West Soccer Club has already committed \$34,000 to this project by funding the installation of lights on fields 4 and 5. Salmon Creek Little League is also a potential partner for this project. It has not committed funding at this time. The Greater Clark Park District (GCPD) capital repair budget will cover the remainder of the cost.

Hockinson Meadows Community Park has 10 sports fields. Seven (7) of the fields have overlapping, or multisport, capabilities. These multi-sport fields drain poorly. This severely limits the use of these fields, impacting the operations for the primary user groups, Pacific Soccer Club and Evergreen Little League. The proposed project application for this park is to install a drainage system, which would improve field use conditions throughout the year and allow for significantly more field use. In addition to RCO, Pacific Soccer Club and Evergreen Little League are two potential partners for this project. Project Expense: \$300,000. RCO Grant Match: \$150,000. Greater Clark Park District (GCPD) capital repair budget and potential partners, if any, will cover the remainder of the cost.



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#### COUNCIL POLICY IMPLICATIONS

This action does not propose a change in policy or a refinement of existing policy. It is a confirmation of existing policy to seek external funding and partnership opportunities to deliver a service the County may not otherwise be able to provide.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The agreement is consistent with existing policy and practice. There will be no additional expense to the current budget by approving these resolutions.

#### **COMMUNITY OUTREACH**

Clark County has created numerous partnerships with local youth sports organizations. The primary role of these partnerships is to provide and encourage athletic opportunities for youth, to make sure County assets remain safe and of high quality, and to partner with groups who can deliver a service the County may not otherwise be able to provide. These partnerships also ensure that children at most, if not all, ages and abilities have ample opportunity to participate in a variety of athletic endeavors.

The remaining 50% expense match will come from the RCO YAF grant program, if approved.
