SUBJECT: Joint Public Hearing: Consideration of the 2016 Comprehensive Plan Update.

INTRODUCTION

Clark County kicked off the 2016 comprehensive plan update consistent with RCW 36. 70A.130 (5)(b) in July of 2013, with a deadline for completion of June 30, 2016. The 20-year update covers the 2015-2035 time horizon.

The purpose of this hearing is to review updates to the comprehensive plan and zoning maps, updated comprehensive plan text, applicable Title 40 updates, capital facilities plans, and the associated impact fees.

BACKGROUND

As part of the update process, the county adopted population and jobs targets and analyzed potential growth alternatives through the SEPA process. The County Council adopted a 'preferred alternative' on February 23, 2016 that was the subject of a final supplemental EIS (FSEIS). A capital facilities plan and capital facilities financial plan have been prepared to show the potential costs of growth over the time horizon.
