Historical Overview Lower River Road

- The County originally acquired this road by Order of Establishment January 15, 1859, by the Board of County Commissioners. (Road Book 1, Page 55)
- March 6, 1928, Clark County re-established Lower River under Order of Establishment by Board of County Commissioners. (Road Book 9, page 70)
- April 14, 1953 CRP# 53-36. Construction plans Lower River Road.
- September 23, 1954, deed filed under AF # G157517 for a 150 foot wide Right-of-way with reversionary rights.
- ☐ In 1964, Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) took ownership of this road.
- Present day. The consideration of a partial road vacation from the gate northerly to it's terminus. (see photo and map)


Lower River Road

Considerations



- Bike advocacy groups and hikers want to retain access rights. (popular bike route)
- Citizen public comments on environmental concerns.
- Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (DWFW) desires to maintain access rights to Southerly point of the Wildlife Refuge.
- Discovery Clean Water Alliance needs access to outfall facility.
- Vancouver Public Schools needs school bus access to residence.
- Clark Public Utilities (CPU) services a resident north of gate. Requires easement rights.
- Deed language noting reversionary rights if not maintained/used as a road/dike.
- Maintenance costs, if retained.
- Legal issues (PA's office to address)
