#### **BACKGROUND**

In February, 2005, voters within the proposed Greater Clark Parks District (GCPD) boundary approved the establishment of the GCPD. The GCPD's purpose is to provide funding for maintenance and selected capital and public outreach expenditures for at least 35 new parks and seven miles of new trails. Funding for these activities is to come primarily from a separately approved property tax levy within the district.

The Board convened in the Councilors' Hearing Room, 6th Floor, Public Service Center, 1300 Franklin Street, Vancouver, Washington. Councilors David Madore, Jeanne E. Stewart, and Tom Mielke present.

9:45 a.m.

**ITEM DESCRIPTION:** To consider approval of the December 2, 2014 minutes.

**ACTION**: Moved by Mielke to **APPROVE** the December 2, 2014 minutes. Stewart seconded the motion. Board members Madore, Stewart, and Mielke voted aye. Motion carried.

<u>ITEM DESCRIPTION:</u> To consider a staff report that request approval of a midbiennium review and modification resolution for the 2015 / 2015 biennial budget for the Greater Clark Parks District in the total amount of \$6,000,000.

Heath Henderson, Public Works Director and Lori Pierce, Finance Manager, Public Works presented. Madore inquired about maintenance funds for Sorensen and Tower Crest. Mark McCauley, County Manager, responded. Mielke inquired about noticing requirements. McCauley responded. Further discussion ensued.

**ACTION**: Moved by Mielke to **APPROVE** the readopt budget resolution for 2015/2016 for the Greater Clark Parks District. Stewart seconded the motion. Board members Mielke, Madore, and Stewart voted aye. Motion carried..

ITEM DESCRIPTION: The Greater Clark Parks District property tax levy for 2016 will also be considered at this time. The Board has option to adopt a property tax resolution for the Greater Clark Parks District levy for 2016. If the Board decides to forego the resolution, they can instead consider a motion to direct Parks staff to prepare a levy certification letter indicating their intent with respect to the 2016 levy. Mielke inquired about property taxes. McCauley responded. Further discussion ensued

#### **Public Comment**

1. Barbara Anderson

ACTION: Moved by Madore to forego adopting a property tax resolution for the Greater Clark Parks District levy and to provide only a letter of levy certification that authorizes the County Assessor to collect last year's levy plus additional revenue resulting from new construction, improvements to property, newly constructed wind turbines, any increase in the value of state assessed property, any annexations that have occurred and refunds made. Mielke seconded the motion. Board members Madore, Stewart, and Mielke voted aye. Motion carried.
