

3 4	A RESOLUTION updating Clark County's transportation policy to align with citizen advisory votes.				
5	WHEREAS, the majority of Clark County voters in numerous elections have clearly conveyed their				
6	support for constructing and improving toll-free roadways and bridges to add capacity to supply				
7	the growing demand, better accommodate the free flow of motor vehicles including freight				
8	mobility, reduce congestion, reduce exhaust emissions, reduce wasted time, improve commerce and				
9	economic prosperity, improve air quality, improve freedom of mobility, and improve quality of life;

11 12	WHEREAS, the majority of Clark County voters in numerous elections have clearly rejected a				
13	contrary philosophy characterized by a "war on cars" that seeks to force people out of their cars,				
14	constrict roadway capacity, and plan insufficient parking, seeks to penalize drivers by adding tolls				
15	to discourage travel, disproportionately prioritizes voter rejected BRT and exorbitantly expensive				
16	light rail projects over roadway improvements, and spends an increasingly disproportionate share				
17	of transportation funds on a decreasing percentage of public transit ridership, and these measures				
18	generally worsen congestion, neglect to appropriately correct failing levels of service, hinder freight				
19 20	mobility, worsen air quality, impede commerce, stagnate economic development, and worsen the quality of life; and







Exhibit A of Transportation Policy Resolution - with Population Metrics
