REQUESTED ACTION:

Board of County Councilors approval to create and fill a 0.60 FTE EHS II project position to staff the Local Source Control (LSC) program in CCPH. Work under the LSC grant has begun with existing Public Health EHS staff. However, restoration of the Site Hazard Assessment (SHA) grant necessitates shifting existing staff to that effort beginning in July 2016, and bringing on new project staff for LSC. The project position will end June 30, 2017.

BACKGROUND

Ecology has established Local Source Control (LSC) technical assistance partnership with CCPH targeting businesses and organizations that manage or generate hazardous waste. The goal is to educate businesses how to properly manage and dispose of hazardous substances in order to prevent harmful exposures to the public and eliminate release of such substances to Washington's surface waters and groundwater.

CCPH's efforts have been and will continue to be focused on environmental justice communities and areas of the county where there is a higher vulnerability to health impacts from exposures to hazardous substances.

CCPH has been notified that Ecology will be restoring the Site Hazard Assessment (SHA) grant in July 2016. An existing FTE EHS II staff person, who had been implementing the SHA grant prior to a stop work notice in December 2015, will be reassigned from their current work on LSC. That action requires CCPH to fill a 0.6 FTE EHS II through June of 2017 to continue implementation of the LSC grant.
