# Animal Protection and Control 2016 Year-End Report

Animal Protection and Control provides animal care seven days a week nearly county wide, handling citizens' calls concerning dog, cat, reptile, cow, horse, snake, otter, falcon, and nearly any other animal-related issue you can imagine. Averaging just two field officers per day in 2016, covering 600 square miles, equated to a very busy program.

Significant changes for 2016 include: new multi-year contracts for domestic animal shelter services; a new animal control truck with a hydraulic cage lift; comprehensive changes to animal codes; and approval of a pet licensing fee increase that will result in a much needed fifth Animal Control Officer beginning in 2017.

The program had a particularly gruesome year with three criminal cases in our court system:

- An owner beating his dogs as shown on elevator video footage
- A dog drug behind its owner's pickup truck
- A cattlemen allowing extreme cruelty and neglect of his herd

We also had a horrific unsolved skinning of a dog requiring forensics analysis by the Oregon State University School of Veterinary Medicine's diagnostic laboratory.



Social media has become a powerful tool to which we cautiously participate. It can provide insight and even answers but can also cause the uninformed public to draw quick, unfounded, and potentially dangerous conclusions. We are learning how best to navigate this new medium.

Three staff members attended the 2016 National Animal Control Association's national conference in Seattle, participating in many unique and insightful classes. They learned what trends are happening



nationally and how other agencies respond to similar types of calls we field locally.
