Whereas, John Deeder dedicated his professional life to the education of children, starting as a sixth-grade teacher and holding nine different positions before being named superintendent of Evergreen Public Schools, having earned his superintendent credential at Lewis and Clark College in 1988; and

Whereas, He has served as superintendent of the 26,000-student Evergreen district, the state's sixth-largest school district, for 11 years; and

Whereas, Mr. Deeder has been a consummate champion for improvements in education for our youth, including all-day kindergarten, smaller class sizes, initiatives to boost graduation rates and greater technology-driven instruction for 21st-century skills; and

Whereas, He launched equity efforts that eliminated economic barriers to student and family participation, and was instrumental in making possible construction of 14 Family and Community Resource Centers; and

Whereas, Under Mr. Deeder's leadership, the district preserved teaching positions during the Great Recession, added a new specialty high school, increased student and staff safety, secured labor agreements, and built a new Crestline Elementary after the school was destroyed by fire in 2013.
