## Amended RESOLUTION NO. 2016-05-08

An amended resolution authorizing all County Departments and Agencies to enter into discussion with the Cowlitz Tribe regarding issues impacting County citizens related to the construction and operation of a casino in northern Clark County.

1	WHEREAS, the Board of County Councilors is charged by state law and the Washington
2	Constitution with enforcing laws to protect the public health, safety, and welfare; and
3	WHEREAS, the United States issued a final decision federally acknowledging the
4	Cowlitz Indian tribe in 2002; and
5	WHEREAS, the Cowlitz Indian Tribe historical connection to its reservation land in
6	Clark County has been recognized by the federal government, and upheld by the U.S. district
7	court for the District of Columbia; and
8	WHEREAS, the issue of whether the United States Department of the Interior, through
9	the Bureau of Indian Affairs, lawfully took the Cowlitz Indian Tribe's land into trust as a
10	reservation for a gambling casino has been resolved in the United States Court of Appeals for the
11	District of Columbia, affirming the district court decision; and
12	WHEREAS, the planned gambling casino complex, including hotel, RV park, conference
13	center and other facilities will create significant impacts on Clark County. These include a need
14	for increased law enforcement in the vicinity of the casino either directly or indirectly, impact to
15	the transportation systems in the area and increased demand for social and health services
16	related to the casino, an increased demand for affordable housing, all of which the Cowlitz
17	Indian Tribe has indicated its intention to mitigate; and
18	WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency authorized without
19	public hearing the onsite sewer system and the Cowlitz Indian Tribe is currently constructing
20	this system; and

21 WHEREAS, the environmental effects of the casino will also include the storm water 22 impacts of newly-developed and very large impervious surfaces and potential water quality 23 effects on the East Fork of the Lewis River, a stream bearing endangered salmon; and 24 WHEREAS, the Cowlitz Indian tribe is continuing construction and will operate 25 commercial establishments which will impact County property interests and resources; and 26 WHEREAS the County desires to engage the Cowlitz Indian Tribe on the issues 27 identified in the Recitals set forth above for the benefit of the citizens of Clark County; and 28 WHEREAS on December 2015 the Board adopted Resolution 2015-12-13 which 29 precludes the County from facilitating agreements with the Tribe regarding the Tribe's 30 planned operations on the reservation property; and

WHEREAS subsequently the County recognized the need for County departments and agencies to enter into discussions with the Tribe regarding the construction of roads in, or impacting county road and right-of-ways, the construction of sewage systems impacting the aquifer which supplies water to County residents, and public safety and security issues, all related to the construction and operation of a casino, to safeguard the safety, health and wellbeing of county residents; and

37 WHEREAS on May 24, 2016 the County adopted Resolution 2016-05-08, which 38 directs the Directors of Public Works, Public Health and Community Development to enter 39 into discussions with the Tribe regarding the above enumerated issues and requests that the Sheriff and Prosecuting Attorney also engage in discussions with the Tribe related to the 40 public safety and security issues related to the potential operation of a casino; and 41 WHEREAS, the Board of County Councilors is considering this matter at a duly-advertised 42 open public meeting and, , the Board finds and concludes that this Resolution is necessary to 43 further the public health and welfare of Clark County citizens; now, therefore, 44

- 45 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND RESOLVED by the Board of County Councilors46 of Clark County, State of Washington, as follows:
- 47 Section 1. Findings. The Board hereby adopts as findings and conclusions those48 facts and conclusions contained in the recitals above.

## Section 2. The Board hereby repeals Resolution 2015-12-13.

Section 3. The Board of County Councilors, in and for the County of Clark, State of
Washington, recognizes the need for all County departments and agencies to be able to enter
into discussions with the Tribe regarding the impacts of the casino operations on County
departments' and agencies' services.

54 Section 3. The Board hereby Amends Resolution 2016-05-08 to authorize the 55 Directors of all County departments to, as needed, and with Board oversight, enter into 56 discussion with the Tribe regarding the above enumerated issues. The Board requests that 57 elected officials also engage in discussions with the Tribe as needed to facilitate resolution of 58 issues related to the public safety and security issues related to the potential operation of a 59 casino. In so directing, the Board recognizes that all agreements with the Tribe will be 60 overseen, approved and entered into by the Board.
