#### BACKGROUND

This project will replace heaved and broken sidewalk along the west side of Highway 99 with a wider, disabled-accessible sidewalk between NE 63<sup>rd</sup> Street and NE 78<sup>th</sup> Street. A mid-block pedestrian crossing with a High-intensity Activated CrossWalk (HAWK) beacon will be constructed about 800 feet south of NE 78<sup>th</sup> Street. A buffered bicycle lane will be added on the west side of Highway 99, along with a bicycle repair station.

For the safety of workers and the traveling public, Clark County may temporarily close portions of one travel lane to through traffic at various times during construction, until October 2017.

The construction documents are complete. Board approval of the attached Notice to Contractors is needed to authorize advertisement of this project once funding approvals from the Washington State Department of Transportation and the Washington State Transportation Improvement Board are received. These approvals are expected in one to two weeks.

#### COUNCIL POLICY IMPLICATIONS

None. This project supports the Council's policy of investing in the county road system by providing safe and efficient transportation systems for all county residents.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY IMPLICATIONS

None. The project is included in the 2017-2022 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), 2017 Annual Construction Program (Item #19) and 2017-2018 budget.

#### COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Outreach for the 2017-2022 TIP included two work sessions and a hearing with the BOCC and presentations to Clark County Planning Commission, Development and Engineering Advisory Board and Clark County Finance Committee, as well as neighborhood outreach and information on the county website. A SEPA review was also included in the Capital Facilities Plan approval process.

Project-specific outreach was conducted with adjoining property owners along with a presentation to the Hazel Dell-Salmon Creek Business Association in May 2016. An informational 'Heads Up' mailing was sent to property owners and tenants along the corridor. Additional outreach with property owners and tenants will be done once a contractor is selected.

Bids will be publicly opened and read aloud at 2:00 P.M., or as soon thereafter as possible, on the same day in the Hearing Room of the Board of County Councilors, 6th Floor of the Public Service Center.

Description of work: The Highway 99 Pedestrian/Bicycle Improvements Project is a partnership to improve pedestrian and bicycle access and safety along Highway (Hwy) 99 between NE 63<sup>rd</sup> Street and NE 78<sup>th</sup> Street in Clark County, Washington. Elements of the three-quarter mile project include sidewalk reconstruction on the west-side of Hwy 99, a new mid-block pedestrian crossing with a refuge island, bicycle lane improvements on the west side, relocated C-Tran bus stops, a street-side bicycle repair station and landscaping.

Primary bid items: (Ex) Roadway Excavation (Incl. Haul); Crushed Surfacing Base Course; HMA Cl. Concrete; Pervious Cement Concrete Sidewalk; Storm Sewer Pipe; Manholes; Conc. Traffic Curb And Gutter; Traffic Signal; Traffic Control; Block Retaining Wall; Striping; Landscaping.


