#### BACKGROUND

Otto Brown Neighborhood Park will be developed on a 7.9-acre parcel on the south side of NE 96th Street at NE 160th Avenue in the Heritage Neighborhood. The project will include grading, drainage, seeding, landscaping, a perimeter asphalt path, play equipment, a sports court, wood chip loop paths, partial irrigation, a nature play area, picnic tables and benches.

The frontage of NE 96th Street will be improved with detached sidewalk, curb, gutter and partial half-street construction. The project was designed with a natural theme that preserves the area's existing vegetation and character. The Parks budget includes funds for ongoing maintenance of this park.

Construction documents are complete. Board approval of the attached Notice to Contractors is needed to authorize bid advertisement of this project, which is scheduled for construction in 2017.
