RESOLUTION NO. 2019-____

A resolution acknowledging an emergency condition that existed on the Chelatchie Prairie Railroad at the NE 72nd Avenue crossing as it relates to waiver of competitive bidding.

1	WHEREAS, the County was made aware of mechanical issues in the concrete
2	panels placed at the railroad crossing at NE 72 nd Avenue in the second week of July 2019;
3	and
4	WHEREAS, the County received a quote on July 19, 2019 for work to repair the
5	condition, which described the condition as an "emergency";
6	WHEREAS, Clark County Public Works investigated the proposed emergency
7	condition of the panels on July 23, 2019, and found that the panels would shift under load,
8	which created a dangerous condition for crossing traffic; and
9	WHEREAS, Public Works decided the condition likely amounted to an
10	"emergency" under RCW 39.04.280(3)(b); and
11	WHEREAS, the condition was discussed with County Manager on July 24, 2019,
12	which resulted in a purchase order being executed for the proposed work; and
13	WHEREAS, RCW 39.04.280(1)(e) allows competitive bidding to be waived in
14	cases of public works emergencies; and
15	WHEREAS, the repair work to the crossing was completed on August 8, 2019; and
16	WHEREAS, RCW 39.04.280(2) requires legislative ratification of the determination
17	regarding an "emergency" condition, thus sanctioning the waiver of competitive bidding;
18	and ;
19	NOW, THEREFORE, the County Council finds that the dangers posed by the damaged
20	crossing panels at NE 72 nd Avenue did pose and emergent condition, as defined in RCW

21 39.04.280(3), to the extent that expeditious repair of the condition justified waiver of

22 competitive bidding for the repair work, pursuant to RCW 39.04.280(1)(e). Despite some

apparent deviation to the procedures detailed in RCW 39.04.280(2)(b), the Council ratifies

24 the conduct of public works in expediting the repair work in the absence of competitive

25 bidding.
