BACKGROUND

Per the attached letter from DEAB, they moved in their recent June meeting to add a member seat to include a representative of the SWCA. This of course is pending the Council's approval. DEAB agrees there is purpose and added value in this member addition given the continued development growth across Clark County, as well as the need for providing additional building/contractor views and experience to the Board. Further, pending the Council's approval, per attached resume materials, Mr. Nelson Holmberg, Executive Director of SWCA was nominated in their recent meeting to represent them and fill this member position.

COUNCIL POLICY IMPLICATIONS

This action supports the general DEAB membership roster the Council originally set forth to include engineers, planners, builders, contractors, developers, attorneys, etc. from the greater development community within Clark County. This also coincides with the current DEAB member from the Building Industry Association (BIA).

ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY IMPLICATIONS

This is a straightforward amendment to the DEAB bylaws to increase the current DEAB membership from 10 to 11. This was similarly done in 2016 to increase the membership from 9 to 10, to include a member slot for commercial or industrial development.
