REQUESTED ACTION:

Board of County Councilor's approval requested to apply for Federal grant funding through the State of Washington, Department of Social and Health Services for the WorkFirst Children with Special Healthcare Needs program. Additionally, request authorization for the Director of Public Health to sign any and all amendments or agreements under the grant. Expected remuneration of \$24,000 for two years.

BACKGROUND

WorkFirst is a state-run program that identifies barriers affecting a parent's ability to prepare for work and offers a variety of services to help them, including:

- information needed to find housing
- reliable transportation

- child care
- child support

Parents who have indicated it would be difficult to participate in DSHS's Work First program due to their child/children's special needs, and who are receiving Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), are referred by the DSHS Community Service Office WorkFirst Social Worker to the Public Health Nurse (PHN) home visiting program. The PHN visits the home, does an evaluation of the child, and reports their findings to the DSHS WorkFirst Social Worker.

This is a recurring Federal grant that has been in place in Public Health for many years and is assumed in Public Health's 2017-18 operating budget. This grant funds a portion of the Children with Special Health Care Needs program, which provides public health nursing services to families who have a child/children with special needs; assesses the child's needs, teaches parents about their child's diagnosis and helps the family coordinate health care and other services to promote the child developing to his/her full potential.
