RESOLUTION NO. 6115 THREE-YEAR SCHOOL PROGRAM RENEWAL LEVY

WHEREAS, the money in and to be paid into the General Fund of Evergreen School District No. 114, Clark County, Washington, (the "District") during the 2019-2020, 2020-2021, 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 school years will be insufficient to enable the District to take care of all of its necessary financial obligations and to properly meet the educational needs of students attending District schools; and

WHEREAS, in 2017 the Washington State Legislature passed the Basic Education Funding Act (Laws of 2017, 3d Spec. Sess., ch. 13) which makes changes to education funding in the state, including re-designating maintenance and operations levies as "enrichment levies," placing limits on levied amounts and directing the deposit of taxes levied commencing in 2020 to a sub-fund of the General Fund; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide for such financial obligations and educational needs, it is deemed necessary that additional taxes in the amounts set forth herein be levied for the District's General Fund for three years upon all of the taxable property within the District; and

WHEREAS, the Constitution and laws of the State of Washington require that the question of whether or not such excess taxes may be levied must be submitted to the qualified electors of the District for their ratification or rejection;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of Evergreen School District No. 114, Clark County, Washington, as follows:

- 1. <u>Declaration of Need</u>. It is hereby found and declared that the welfare of the students and other residents of the District require the District to carry out the plans described herein to pay part of the general expenses of the enrichment programs and operation of the District.
- 2. Authorization of Levies. In order to provide funds for the enrichment programs and operation of the District as described in Section 3 below, the following taxes for the District's General Fund should be levied upon all of the taxable property within the District in excess of the maximum annual tax levy permitted by law to be levied for the District without a vote of the electors:

The excess taxes identified above replace the expiring maintenance and operation levies that were previously authorized by the voters of the District.

The exact levy rate and the actual amounts to be collected shall be adjusted based upon the actual assessed value of the property within the District at the time of the levy and the legal limit on the levy rate and levy amount applicable at the time of the levy.

- 3. Voter approval; Use of Levy Funds. Upon approval by the District's voters of the ballot proposition described in Section 4 below, the District may use the proceeds of the levies to pay such part of the general expenses of the enrichment programs and operation of the District as may be authorized or allowed by law for the use of excess levy funds, and to repay warrants or other lawful indebtedness incurred to defray such enrichment programs and operation expenses.
- 4. <u>Declaration of Emergency: Election</u>. It is hereby found and declared that an emergency exists requiring the submission of the proposition of whether or not such excess taxes should be levied for ratification or rejection by the qualified electors of the District, at a special election to be held on February 12, 2019. The Clark County Auditor as <u>ex officio</u> supervisor of elections in said county is hereby requested to also find the existence of such emergency and to call and conduct the special election to be held within the District on said date and to submit to the qualified electors of the District the proposition set forth below. The Secretary of the Board of Directors is hereby authorized and directed to certify the proposition in the following form:

PROPOSITION NO. 1 SCHOOL PROGRAM RENEWAL LEVY

The Board of Directors of Evergreen School District No. 114 adopted Resolution No. 6115 concerning renewal of an expiring levy for educational programs and operations. This proposition provides funding for educational programs and operations expenses not funded by the State. If approved, Proposition 1 will authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, on all taxable property within the District, as provided in Resolution No. 6115.
