RESOLUTION NO. 814

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Directors of Vancouver School District No. 37, Clark County, Washington, providing for the submission to the qualified electors of the district at a special election to be held therein on February 12, 2019, of propositions to levy general taxes upon the taxable property within the school district in excess of the constitutional and statutory limitations. An education and operations levy shall be made in 2019 for collections in 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023, the proceeds thereof to be credited to the general fund of Vancouver School District No. 37 to provide revenue required to assist in improving the general education program. Furthermore, a technology levy shall be made in 2019 for collection in 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024, and 2025, the proceeds thereof to be credited to the capital projects fund of Vancouver School District No. 37 to fund updated technology, software, and digital learning tools for classrooms in all schools, plus training for teachers. Said propositions to read as follows:

Proposition #3: Shall a four-year levy, replacing the expiring levy for Vancouver School District No. 37, be collected to maintain and operate general education programs in the amount of \$32,775,000 (collected in 2020 at approximately \$1.50 per \$1,000 assessed valuation), \$35,400,000 (collected in 2021 at approximately \$1.50 per \$1,000 assessed valuation), \$38,225,000 (collected in 2022 at approximately \$1.50 per \$1,000 assessed valuation), and \$41,300,000 (collected in 2023 at approximately \$1.50 per \$1,000 assessed valuation).

Proposition #4: Shall a six-year technology levy, replacing the expiring levy, for Vancouver School District No. 37 be collected to fund updated technology, software, and digital learning tools for classrooms in all schools, plus training for teachers in the amount of \$6,965,000 (collected in 2020 at approximately 32 cents per \$1,000 assessed valuation), \$7,400,500 (collected in 2021 at approximately 31 cents per \$1,000 assessed valuation), \$7,930,000 (collected in 2022 at approximately 31 cents per \$1,000 assessed valuation), \$8,425,000 (collected in 2023 at approximately 31 cents per \$1,000 assessed valuation), \$8,840,000 (collected in 2024 at approximately 30 cents per \$1,000 assessed valuation), and \$9,252,000 (collected in 2025 at approximately 30 cents per \$1,000 assessed valuation)? If Proposition #2 is approved but Proposition #1 is not approved, this tax will not be collected.

WHEREAS, Vancouver School District No. 37, ("District"), does not have sufficient local 8 am 10:41 funds to meet all its needs; therefore,

IT IS RESOLVED that it has been determined an emergency does exist and the District Board of Directors finds it necessary to ask the Clark County Auditor to place before the voters a Special Levy election in the district on February 12, 2019, for general fund expenses in the amount of \$32,775,000 in 2020, \$35,400,000 in 2021, \$38,225,000 in 2022, and \$41,300,000 in 2023 for Proposition #1.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, to provide improved opportunities for the students in the district to include, but not be limited to funding updated technology, software, and digital learning tools for classrooms in all schools, plus training for teachers, the Board of Directors finds it necessary to ask the Clark County Auditor to place before the voters a technology levy in the amount of \$6,965,000 in 2020, \$7,400,500 in 2021, \$7,930,000 in 2022, \$8,425,000 in 2023, \$8,840,000 in 2024, and \$9,252,000 in 2025 for Proposition #2.

The Clark County Auditor, as ex officio supervisor of elections in Clark County, Washington, is hereby requested to call and conduct a special election to be held within the District on February 12, 2019, and to submit to the qualified electors of the district the proposition hereinafter set forth.

The Secretary of the Board of Directors is hereby authorized and directed to certify such proposition substantially in the following form:

REPLACEMENT LEVY FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS

The Board of Directors of Vancouver School District No. 37 passed Resolution No. 814 concerning this proposition to maintain current educational funding. This proposition authorizes the District to continue funding students' educational needs and school operations by levying the following excess taxes to replace an expiring levy on all taxable property within the District, for educational programs and daily operational expenses, including textbooks, classroom materials and staff:
