



CLARK COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH RECREATIONAL WATER SAFETY PROGRAM 2020 FEE SCHEDULE

The definitions and fees listed below are for general informational purposes only.
Please consult Clark County Public Health (CCPH) with the specifics of your operation.

RECREATIONAL WATER FACILITY PLAN REVIEW	
One time only fee paid before beginning construction of a recreational water facility.	
5011 Pool/Spa	\$ 1,911
Any construction project that includes a new pool, spa or recreational water feature.	
5014 Pool/Spa Variance	\$ 273
A review of a proposed deviation from the recreational water code for a new construction project or existing recreational water facility concerning the operation plan, facility and/or equipment. These are case by case and a review does not guarantee approval.	
5015 Float Tank Facility	\$ 1,433
Any construction project that includes a float pod or cabin, including prefabricated and custom built chambers. This includes existing facilities wanting to expand to include floatation tanks and new facilities.	
5016 Change of Ownership	\$ 478
Ownership change of a recreational water facility. Permits are nontransferable and must be submitted within 30 days of the change of ownership.	
Pool/Spa Remodel	\$ 546
Any project that includes the remodel of an existing pool, spa, water feature, barrier, restroom facilities or adjacent building.	
Other Fees	
5211 Inspection follow-up	\$ 410
Required if a routine inspection identifies an imminent health hazard or results in 3 repeat critical violations.	
5013 Additional Rec Water Services (per hour)	\$ 135.02

OPERATING PERMIT	
An annual fee for service that includes routine inspections and health department support as needed.	
5111 Pool/Spa "Year-Round"	\$ 1,092
This annual permit allows for one recreational water body to be open for up to twelve months.	
5113 Pool/Spa "Seasonal"	\$ 1,092
This seasonal permit allows one recreational water body to be open for 6 consecutive months from May 1st to October 31st.	
5116 Float Tank Facility	\$ 410
This annual permit allows a facility to operate floatation tanks/cabins in their facility.	
5117 Inactive Pool	\$ 205
This annual permit supports the monitoring of a pool, spa or water feature facility that has been closed for more than 12 consecutive months and has not been backfilled or permanently demolished.	
5118 Non-Recirculating Water Feature	\$ 137
This permit allows for one splash pad or fountain that discharge wastewater directly to the sewer to be open to the public.	
5119 Recirculating Water Feature	\$ 341
This permit allows for one splash pad or fountain that recirculates water and maintains a residual disinfectant level to be open to the public.	
5115 Additional Pool/Spa (each)	\$205
For each recreational body of water in addition to the first permitted body of water, an additional fee is applied.
