SEEKING VOLUNTEERS FOR THE GREEN BAG PROGRAM!

In our newsletter last October, an article explained how the Green Bag Project works. If our neighborhood association wishes to participate, we need at least 5 people to volunteer to serve as collectors. Each collector decides how many and who would be in their group. The collector recruits as many people as he/she wants: among neighbors, church members, book group members, or a group of friends.

If you wish to be a volunteer collector, please email your name, address, and how many people you are planning to have in your group as soon as possible to sunnyside nava@yahoo.com. I will send you a flyer that explains the details of the program that you can hand out to people you wish to recruit. Then you will receive a green bag for each one. The group members then buy one extra nonperishable grocery item each week when they go the supermarket and store the food items in the green food bag. The bags are picked up by the volunteer collector once every two months on the scheduled day and the food would be donated to a food bank that serves our neighbors and neighborhood.

Other neighborhood associations who are participating include Truman NA and Hazel Dell NA, as well as people in Battle Ground and Ridgefield.

According to Debbie Nelson, Truman NA, who has lived in Truman for 30 years, "It is more of a donor drive than a food drive. It's almost an excuse for neighbors to meet and do something positive together by providing pantries a steady supply of food. It's feeling a lot more like a real neighborhood to me. It's really about building relationships and connections. It gives people an excuse for saying hello."
